A RESOLUTION OF THE REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO STATING FOR THE RECORD THAT THE AGENCY HAS PREVIOUSLY REVIEWED AND CONSIDERED THE INFORMATION CONTAINED IN THE FINAL MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENT WITH RESPECT TO THE CONSTRUCTION OF IMPROVEMENTS FOR THE PARK BOULEVARD AT HARBOR DRIVE PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE PROJECT LOCATED IN THE EAST VILLAGE REDEVELOPMENT DISTRICT OF THE EXPANSION SUB AREA OF THE CENTRE CITY REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT.

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Agency of the City of San Diego [Agency] is engaged in activities necessary to carry out and implement the Redevelopment Plan for the East Village Redevelopment District Area of the Centre City Redevelopment Project [Project]; and

WHEREAS, in order to carry out and implement the Redevelopment Plan, the Agency proposes to pay for all or part of the construction of improvements for the Park Boulevard at Harbor Drive Pedestrian Bridge Project located at Park Boulevard and Harbor Drive [Pedestrian Bridge Project] in the East Village Redevelopment District; and

WHEREAS, the Agency previously approved the Basic Concept/Schematic Drawings for construction of the Pedestrian Bridge Project on February 8, 2005, by Redevelopment Agency Resolution No. R-03868; and

WHEREAS, the Agency has previously prepared, and the Agency and the City Council have certified the Final Master Environmental Impact Report for the Centre City Redevelopment Project (referred to herein as the "MEIR") through Resolution No. 2081 and Resolution No. 279875, respectively; and

WHEREAS, the Agency has also previously prepared, and the Agency and the City Council have certified the Final Subsequent Environmental Impact Report to the MEIR for the Proposed Ballpark and Ancillary Development Projects, and Associated Plan Amendments (referred to herein as the "SEIR") through Resolution No. 03058 and Resolution No. 292363, respectively; and

WHEREAS, the MEIR, as supplemented by the SEIR, for the Project is sometimes referred to collectively herein as the MEIR/SEIR; and

WHEREAS, the development of the Project is a redevelopment implementation activity whose environmental impacts are assessed in the MEIR/SEIR; and

WHEREAS, the Centre City Development Corporation [Corporation], acting on behalf of the Agency, prepared a Mitigated Negative Declaration [MND] in accordance with and pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act of 1970 [CEQA] and state and local regulations and guidelines adopted pursuant thereto, and such MND assessed the environmental impacts of the development of the pedestrian bridge; and

WHEREAS, the Agency considered the environmental effects of the proposed development as shown in the MEIR/SEIR and the MND, and the Agency through Resolution No. 3869 certified the MND; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Redevelopment Agency of the City of San Diego stating for the record that the information contained in the Final MND, including any comments received during the public review process, has been previously reviewed and considered by the Agency and it is determined that no substantial changes or new information of substantial importance within the meaning of NEPA and CEQA would warrant any additional environmental review in

connection with approval of construction of the Parl	Boulevard at Harbor Drive Pedestrian
Bridge Project.
