RESOLUTION NO. R-03007

ADOPTED ON JUNE 29, 1999

A RESOLUTION OF THE REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO ADOPTING ANNUAL PROGRAM BUDGETS FOR FISCAL YEAR 1999-2000 FOR THE REDEVELOPMENT PROJECTS ADMINISTERED BY THE CENTRE CITY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION, THE SOUTHEASTERN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION, AND THE REDEVELOPMENT DIVISION OF THE CITY'S ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND COMMUNITY SERVICES DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Agency of The City of San Diego [Agency] is engaged in activities necessary to carry out and implement redevelopment plans for The City of San Diego; and

WHEREAS, the Centre City Development Corporation, Inc. [CCDC], has been authorized to administer the redevelopment projects in the Centre City area; the Southeastern Economic Development Corporation [SEDC] has been authorized to administer the redevelopment projects in the Southeastern San Diego area; and the Redevelopment Division of the City's Economic Development and Community Services Department [Redevelopment] has been authorized to administer the redevelopment projects in all areas of the City other than Centre City and Southeastern San Diego; and

WHEREAS, a comprehensive description of redevelopment activities is contained in the Proposed Redevelopment Agency Budget, Fiscal Year 1999-2000, on file in the Office of the Secretary to the Agency as Document No. D-03007, and describes redevelopment activities

administered by CCDC (Horton Plaza and Centre City Redevelopment Projects); SEDC (Central Imperial, Gateway Center West, Mount Hope, and Southcrest Redevelopment Projects; Dells Imperial Study Area; and SEDC's special projects); and Redevelopment (Barrio Logan, City Heights, College Community, College Grove, Linda Vista, Market Street, Naval Training Center, North Bay, North Park, and San Ysidro Redevelopment Projects; and the Barrio Logan Expansion Study Area and the Pacific Beach Feasibility Study Area); NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Redevelopment Agency of The City of San Diego, as follows:

- 1. That the proposed Fiscal Year 1999-2000 program and project budgets administered by CCDC, SEDC, and Redevelopment as contained in the "Redevelopment Agency of The City of San Diego, Proposed Budget, Fiscal Year 2000," a copy of which is on file in the Office of the Secretary to the Agency as Document No. D-03007, is accepted and adopted.
- 2. That approval of this budget constitutes authority for the expenditure of funds by CCDC, SEDC, and Redevelopment in Fiscal Year 1999-2000, provided that funds are available from the tax increment generated by the projects; from bond, land sales, and developer proceeds; from funds allocated by the Council of The City of San Diego from such sources as Transient Occupancy Tax, Community Development Block Grants, sales tax and others; and from the allocation of funds by such entities as the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, the Economic Development Administration, and others.
- 3. That the City Auditor and Comptroller is authorized to (a) establish the necessary accounts, (b) appropriate and allot all monies available in each project fund up to the amounts budgeted herein, and (c) record the expenditures of funds and the recovery of all accrued costs subject to the amount of revenues available in each project fund.
 - 4. That any monies deposited in the project funds are appropriated and may be

expended for the purpose for which the funds were created.

- 5. That the City Auditor and Comptroller is authorized to carry forward any unexpended balance remaining in each budgetary account at the end of each fiscal year into the next fiscal year as a continuing appropriation, subject to amendment by the Agency.
- 6. That the President of CCDC, or designee, is authorized to (a) expend funds as appropriate for the implementation of Centre City redevelopment projects, (b) request the City Auditor and Comptroller to make budgetary transfers between the line items and object accounts within each project fund, and (c) request the City Auditor and Comptroller to transfer or loan funds between subprojects within a project.
- 7. That the President of SEDC, or designee, is authorized to (a) expend funds as appropriate for the implementation of Southeastern San Diego redevelopment projects, (b) request the City Auditor and Comptroller to make budgetary transfers between the line items and object accounts within each project fund, and (c) request the City Auditor and Comptroller to transfer or loan funds between subprojects within a project.
- 8. That, as to Redevelopment, the Executive Director of the Agency, or designee, is authorized to (a) expend funds as appropriate for the implementation of redevelopment projects, (b) request the City Auditor and Comptroller to make budgetary transfers between the line items and object accounts within each project fund, and (c) request the City Auditor and Comptroller to transfer or loan funds between subprojects within a project.
- 9. That the Agency authorizes the City Auditor and Comptroller, upon the request of CCDC, SEDC, or Redevelopment, to transfer or loan funds between subprojects within a project administered by the requesting entity, provided that such transfers or loans do not increase or decrease the total project budget or result in a use of such funds which would be inconsistent with the permitted use(s) of such funds.

10. That any and all funds advanced by The City of San Diego to the Agency for the

purpose of implementing the adopted budgets are to be considered as loans to be repaid from tax

increment revenues or other revenues.

11. That any and all debts of the Agency to The City of San Diego shall accrue

interest at the rate approved by the Council of The City of San Diego; such interest accrual to be

calculated by the City Auditor and Comptroller.

12. That in the event that the Agency desires to issue bonds, notes, or other

instruments of indebtedness of the Agency to carry out redevelopment projects, then any

indebtedness of the Agency to The City of San Diego, including any interest accrued thereon,

shall be deemed not to be a first pledge of tax increment allocations received by the Agency

pursuant to California Health and Safety Code section 33670; and any indebtedness of the

Agency to The City of San Diego, including any interest accrued thereon, shall be subordinate to

any pledge of tax increments to bondholders or the holders of other such instruments of

indebtedness.

13. That in the event the Agency has not adopted the 2000-2001 budget and

appropriations resolution prior to the beginning of Fiscal Year 2000-2001, the City Auditor and

Comptroller shall approve the payments necessary for the Agency to continue to conduct

business at the funding levels approved by this resolution for Fiscal Year 1999-2000.
