ITEM-1: REQUEST TO HEAR AN APPEAL Relative to Hearing Officer's Decision regarding Symbolic Markets, Inc., Type 20 Liquor License: Chief of Police

ITEM-2 In the matter of **NEGLECTED, FORECLOSED, AND ABANDONED HOMES INCREASING THE RISK TO PUBLIC SAFETY AND PUBLIC HEALTH IN SAN DIEGO NEIGHBORHOODS**

ACTION: Motion by Council President Pro Tem Young, second by Chair Maienschein, to request the City Attorney return to the Committee on October 31, 2007, with a draft ordinance that would include the following: 1) requiring all properties that enter the foreclosure process be reported to the City's Neighborhood Code Compliance Department; 2) require the lenders' financial institutions or others responsible for the property, to register with the City when they file their first notice of default; 3) require responsible parties to regulate and maintain their properties or face fines and penalties; and 4) to take into account the City's budgetary issues.

Version C: All La Jolla beaches, coastal rights-of-way, and coastal parks (year-round); and

Version D: All beaches and all coastal rights-of-way in Council Districts 1 and 2, and all coastal parks in Council District 2 (year-round)
