ITEM-7: Report from the City Planning and Community Investment Department regarding FY10 CDBG Entitlement – Second Public Hearing Allocation Methodology

ACTION: Motion by Councilmember Gloria, second by Councilmember Young, to waive Council Policy 700-02 to allow the entire \$1,661,280.00 be allocated by City Council for the following purposes and projects:

- a) The amount of \$902,003.00 be allocated to the Housing Commission for the development and acquisition of affordable housing;
- b) The amount of \$550,000.00 be allocated to Urban Corps for the development of its Youth Training Center;
- c) The amount of \$157,000.00 be allocated to San Diego Second Chance for development of its Community Resource Center; and
- d) The amount of \$52,277.00 be allocated toward the Park & Recreation Department’s Therapeutic Recreation Program in order to reduce General Fund expenditures for this program. \$52,277.00 should then be reprogrammed from the General Fund toward Appropriated Reserves.

In addition to these projects, it is requested that each Council District award all remaining FY2010 entitlement funds and that CDBG staff require allocation memos from each Council District for this purpose no later than June 19, 2009.
