Chair Lightner announced that Item #4, "Report from Civic San Diego regarding New Market Tax Credits and Other Strategies for Community Development" will be continued to the next available R&ED Committee meeting.

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Approval of the Record of Action Items for April 24, 2013.

ACTION: Motion by Councilmember Emerald, second by Vice Chair Faulconer, to approve.

VOTE: 5-0; Lightner-yea, Faulconer-yea, Kersey- yea, Alvarez-yea, Emerald-yea

ACTION/DISCUSSION ITEMS

ITEM-1: Report from the Ethics Commission regarding Recommendation Concerning Political Party Contribution Limits and Recommending the Adoption of an Ordinance Amending the Municipal Code relating to Political Party Campaign Contribution Limits

ACTION: Motion by Vice Chair Faulconer, second by Councilmember Kersey, to recommend that the City Council adopt an ordinance amending the Municipal Code relating to political party campaign contribution limits in the amounts of \$3,000 per election for district candidates and \$12,000 per election for citywide candidates.

VOTE: 2-3; Lightner-nay, Faulconer-yea, Kersey- yea, Alvarez-nay, Emerald-nay (*Motion failed*)

ACTION: Motion by Councilmember Emerald, second by Chair Lightner, to recommend that the City Council adopt an ordinance amending the Municipal Code relating to political party campaign contribution limits in the amounts of \$10,000 per election for district candidates and \$20,000 per election for citywide candidates. Councilmember Emerald requested that the City Attorney draft the proposed ordinance to take effect June 2, 2013, using Charter section 295 (d).

VOTE: 3-2; Lightner-yea, Faulconer-nay, Kersey-nay, Alvarez-yea, Emerald-yea

Also, during discussion of the item, Deputy City Attorney Gleeson stated that the City Attorney's Office would review whether Charter section 295 can be applied to the proposed ordinance and will draft the ordinance accordingly.

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ITEM-2: Report from the Economic Development Department Recommending Designating a New San Diego Regional Target Employment Area for 2013

ACTION: Motion by Councilmember Alvarez, second by Councilmember Emerald, to approve staff recommendation that the City Council approve the new boundaries for the 2013 San Diego Regional Targeted Employment Area, and that staff return to the R&ED Committee with the second expansion to Enterprise Zone Program within 60 days.

VOTE: 5-0; Lightner-yea, Faulconer-yea, Kersey-yea, Alvarez-yea,

ITEM-3: Report from the Mayor's Office Recommending the Adoption of an Ordinance Addressing the Applicability of State Prevailing Wage Laws to Municipal Projects

ACTION: Motion by Councilmember Kersey, second by Vice Chair Faulconer, requesting that:

- Staff work with stakeholders and the City Attorney to prepare a draft ordinance for consideration by the R&ED Committee.

- Independent Budget Analyst review City staff-prepared list of projects that would be subject to prevailing wage based upon the proposed ordinance, and provide an analysis of how much, on an average annual basis, this will cost or save the city.

- City Attorney provide legal analysis regarding Senate Bill 7, titled, "An act to add Section 1782 to the Labor Code, relating to public works," and the proposed ordinance, and return to the R&ED Committee with an ordinance or resolution, as appropriate based on the legal analysis.

- Staff provide a report addressing questions raised by the IBA, as well as Councilmembers at the May 15, 2013 meeting.


