form <u>prior</u> to the meeting. Subject matter and time limitations are noted on the form. Pursuant to open meeting laws, no discussion or action, other than a referral, shall be taken by the Committee on any issue brought forth under APublic Comment.@

If a COMMUNICATION REQUEST FORM is submitted to the City Clerk seven (7) calendar days prior to the Committee meeting, the matter may be placed on the agenda as a scheduled communication and the Committee may discuss the item prior to its appropriate disposition.

<u>REQUESTS FOR CONTINUANCE</u>: Members of the public may request an item be postponed or rescheduled by submitting <u>prior</u> to the meeting a "Request to Speak" form and asking that the matter be "continued." The decision whether to continue the matter is at the Council's discretion.

<u>CONSENT AGENDA</u>: The Chair may entertain a motion by a Committee Member to approve certain noncontroversial agenda items as consent agenda items at the beginning of the meeting.

<u>COUNCIL COMMENT</u>: Committee Members may make brief announcements or give a brief report on their activities on matters not on the agenda. Additionally, non-Committee Councilmembers may appear and address the Committee on any agenda item, although non-Committee Members may not deliberate or vote on such matters.
