July 29, 1994 REPORT TO THE HONORABLE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL

SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION OF NOVEMBER 8, 1994

In accordance with Resolutions Numbered R-95-68 and R-95-72, adopted at the City Council meeting of July 25, 1994, the City Attorney has prepared the following ordinances and one resolution pertaining to the November 8, 1994, Special Municipal Election:

Ordinance No. O-95-6:

This ordinance calls a Special Municipal Election to be held in the City on November 8, 1994. It also orders this Municipal Special Election to be consolidated with the Statewide General Election to be held on the same date. It also submits one proposition to the voters at this election to amend Section 141 of the City Charter pertaining to the City Employees' Retirement System. Specifically, if adopted, the charter amendment would delete the term "continuous" and in its place substitute the phrase "for which payment has been made" to describe the service required for a retirement allowance from the City Employees' Retirement System.

Ordinance No. O-95-7:

This ordinance submits one proposition to the voters to adopt an ordinance changing the City's appropriations limit for Fiscal Years 1996 through 1999 at the Special Municipal Election to be held on November 8, 1994.

Resolution No. R-95-237:

The resolution requests the County of San Diego's Board of Supervisors to conduct the City's Special Municipal Election on November 8, 1994 and to consolidate it with the Statewide General Election. It also sets forth the City's agreement to reimburse the County of San Diego for services performed by the Registrar of Voters in connection with the Special Municipal Election in an amount not to exceed \$300,000.
