# NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL

## ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

PLANNING DEPARTMENT

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**PROJECT NAME/NUMBER:** Special Event Permit – Honor Ride San Diego

**COMMUNITY PLAN AREA:** Downtown, Barrio Logan

**COUNCIL DISTRICT:** 3

**LOCATION:** Pacific Highway, Harbor Drive, County of San Diego Waterfront Park

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** Special Event Permit for lane closures within San Diego that would be associated with a bicycle riding event and festival that would occur at the County of San Diego Waterfront Park at the Embarcadero on December 3, 2016. Noise associated with the event activities and set-up/dismantling would occur from 3 PM on December 2, 2016, until 7 PM on December 3, 2016. There would be three different routes that would all begin and end at Waterfront Park. The portion of the routes that would occur within the City of San Diego's jurisdiction would include Pacific Highway between Grape Street and North Harbor Drive, and North Harbor Drive between Pacific Highway and the City's boundary with National City. Lane closures would occur from 7 AM until 10 AM on December 3, 2016, and would include one NB lane and the parking area on Harbor Drive between the first perpendicular sidewalk entrance north of Ash Street and Grape Street, one e/b lane of Grape Street between Harbor Drive and Pacific Highway, and one s/b lane of Pacific Highway between Grape and Ash Streets. Riders would follow the rules of the roads for the rest of the routes and no road closures would occur with this event. There would be announcements/entertainment and sound amplification would occur from 6:30 AM until 3 PM on December 3, 2016. On December 2, 2016, set-up would occur from 3 PM until 7 PM. On December 3, 2016, set-up would occur from 5 AM until 6:30 AM, the event would occur from 6:30 AM until 2 PM, and dismantling would occur from 2 PM until 7 PM.

**ENTITY MAKING ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION:** City of San Diego Mayor–Appointed Designee

**STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION:** The City of San Diego conducted an environmental review and determined the project meets the categorical exemption criteria set forth in the CEQA State Guidelines: §Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) which allows for the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing or minor alterations of existing public or private structures or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use; §Section 15304(e) (Minor Alterations to Land) which allows for minor, temporary use of land that has negligible or no permanent effects on the environment;

§Section 15311 (Accessory Structures) which allows for construction, or placement of minor structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities, including, but not limited to, temporary use items in publicly owned facilities or other facilities designated for public use.

In addition, the exceptions set forth in the CEQA State Guidelines §15300.2 do not apply to this project wherein: a) the project would not impact an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern where designated, precisely mapped, and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies; b) no cumulative impacts of successive projects of the same type in the same place were identified; c) there is no reasonable possibility that the project would have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances; d) the project would not result in damage to scenic resources, including but not limited to, trees, historic buildings, rock outcroppings, or similar resources, within a highway officially designated as a state scenic highway; e) the project is not located on a site which is included on any list compiled pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code; and f) the project would not cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of a historical resource.
