REVISED NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

PROJECT NAME/NUMBER: Special Event Permit – Everywon San Diego

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: Downtown

COUNCIL DISTRICT: 3 and 8

LOCATION: City roadways in Downtown listed below

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Special Event Permit for a 5K race and festival event that would include the race, a stage, entertainment, and the temporary use of tables, chairs, and canopies that would occur on December 11, 2016. Noise associated with the event activities and set-up/dismantling would occur from 5 AM on December 10, 2016, until 7 PM on December 11, 2016. The 5K race route would begin downtown on Park Boulevard heading west, turn right onto Tony Gwynn Drive/7th Avenue heading north, turn left onto Island Avenue, turn left onto 5th Avenue, turn right onto MLK Promenade, turn left onto Market Street, turn left onto MLK Promenade, turn left onto Switzer Street/Taxi Access, turn right onto Switzer Street, turn left onto Gull Street, continue right onto Gull Street, turn left onto Park Boulevard/Convention Center Way sidewalk, continue onto promenade, turn left onto Marina Park Way, u-turn turn around point, and turn right onto promenade to the finish line. Road closures associated with the event that would occur from 6:30 AM until 9 AM would include Park Boulevard between Imperial Avenue and Tony Gwynn Drive, Tony Gwynn Drive/7th Avenue between Park Boulevard and Island Avenue, E/B lane of Island Avenue between 7th and 5th Avenues, 5th Avenue between Island Avenue and J Street, S/B lane of 5th Avenue between J Street and Harbor Drive, Martin Luther King Promenade between Market Street and Park Boulevard Intersect, W/B Harbor Drive bike lane between MLK Promenade and Switzer Street/Taxi access, Switzer Street Taxi access between Harbor Drive and Switzer Street, E/B lane of Switzer Street between taxi access and Gull Street, N/B lane of Gull Street between Switzer Street and Park Boulevard, Convention Way sidewalk between Gull street and 5th Avenue Landing, Marina Park Way, and 5th Avenue Landing Path between Marina Park Way and Bay Front Park. There would be a speaker system used for announcements/entertainment, and sound amplification would occur from 6:30 AM until 12 PM. On December 10, 2016, set-up would occur from 5 AM until 9 PM. On December 11, 2016, set-up would occur from 2 AM until 7 AM, the event would occur from 7 AM until 12 PM, and dismantling would occur from 12 PM until 7 PM.

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The City of San Diego conducted an environmental review and determined the project meets the categorical exemption criteria set forth in the CEQA State Guidelines: §Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) which allows for the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing or minor alterations of existing public or private structures or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use; §Section 15304(e) (Minor Alterations to Land) which allows for minor, temporary use of land that has negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; §Section 15311 (Accessory Structures) which allows for construction, or placement of minor structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities, including, but not limited to, temporary use items in publicly owned facilities or other facilities designated for public use.

In addition, the exceptions set forth in the CEQA State Guidelines §15300.2 do not apply to this project wherein: a) the project would not impact an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern where designated, precisely mapped, and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies; b) no cumulative impacts of successive projects of the same type in the same place were identified; c) there is no reasonable possibility that the project would have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances; d) the project would not result in damage to scenic resources, including but not limited to, trees, historic buildings, rock outcroppings, or similar resources, within a highway officially designated as a state scenic highway; e) the project is not located on a site which is included on any list compiled pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code; and f) the project would not cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of a historical resource.
