NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

PROJECT NAME: Evans Pond Reclaimed Water Pipeline Inst

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: Scripps Miramar Ranch

COUNCIL DISTRICT: 5

LOCATION: Along Meanley Drive, through the pedestrian corridor connecting Meanley Drive to the Scripps Ranch Library, through the Scripps Ranch Library parking lot.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: This project will install 1250 feet of two 2-inch diameter reclaimed water pipelines that will run in parallel, adjacent to the graded, previously disturbed and developed concrete walkway that runs from Meanley Drive to the Scripps Ranch Library parking lot and ends in the turf irrigated area adjacent to the pond. The pipes will be buried at a depth of 4 feet and trench width of 1 foot to 1 ½ feet. All construction activities are to happen in previously disturbed and developed areas.

ENTITY CONSIDERING PROJECT APPROVAL: City of San Diego

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: Categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA State Guidelines Section 15303 (New Construction), and 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land).

ENTITY MAKING ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: City of San Diego Public Works Department

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The City of San Diego conducted an environmental review and determined the project meets the categorical exemption criteria set forth in the CEQA State Guidelines Sections 15303, which allows for the construction of limited numbers of new, small facilities, (i.e. pipelines), and 15304, which allows minor public alterations in the condition of land which do not involve removal of healthy, mature, scenic trees, including minor

trenching and backfilling where the surface is restored (i.e. trenching for pipeline and pavement resurfacing); and when the project does not trigger any of the exceptions to categorical exemptions found in State CEQA Guidelines, Section 15300.2. This project would not impact sensitive resources.
