

CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO

Section 26

1. Original Charter section approved by voters April 7, 1931

Section 26. ADMINISTRATIVE CODE. The existing Departments, Divisions and Boards and existing Offices of the City Government are hereby continued unless changed by the provisions of this Charter or by ordinance of the Council. The Council shall by ordinance, by majority vote, adopt an administrative code providing for the details powers and duties of the administrative offices and departments of the City Government, based upon the provisions of this Charter. Thereafter, except as established by the provisions of this Charter, the Council may change, abolish, combine, and rearrange the departments, divisions and boards of the City Government provided for in said administrative code, but such ordinance creating, combining, abolishing or decreasing the powers of any department, division or board shall require a vote of five (5) of the members of the Council. The Council may by ordinance, if authorized so to do by the general law of the State, provide that any function of the City may be performed by the County officer in charge of that respective function for the County or for the establishment of a combined City and County district for the performance of any function.

Section 26. ADMINISTRATIVE CODE. The existing Departments, Divisions and Boards and existing Offices of the City Government are hereby continued unless changed by the provisions of this Charter or by ordinance of the Council. The Council shall by ordinance, by majority vote, adopt an administrative code providing for the detailed powers and duties of the administrative offices and departments of the City Government, based upon the provisions of this Charter. Thereafter, except as established by the provisions of this Charter, the Council may change, abolish, combine, and rearrange the departments, divisions and boards of the City Government provided for in said administrative code, but such ordinance creating, combining, abolishing or decreasing the powers of any department, division or board shall require a vote of two-thirds of the members elected to the Council. The Council may by ordinance, if authorized so to do by the general law of the State, provide that any function of the City may be performed by the County officer in charge of that respective function for the County or for the establishment of a combined City and County district for the performance of any function.
