AN ORDINANCE SETTING ASIDE AND DEDICATING CERTAIN
TIDE AND SUBMERGED LANDS IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO
FOR A PUBLIC PARK, AND NAMING SAID PARK "SAN DIEGO
LA JOLLA UNDERWATER PARK."

WHEREAS, The City of San Diego is the owner of certain
tide and submerged lands in the City of San Diego; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the people of the City of
San Diego to set aside and dedicate forever said tide and
submerged lands for public use and enjoyment as and for a
public park to be used by all the public for recreational
uses; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent and the purpose of the people
of the City of San Diego to maintain said park as an
underwater park and marine life reserve to the end that the
total environment, geological, biological and botanical, of
the area be preserved and protected; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego,
as follows:

Section 1. That the hereinafter described real property
be, and the same is hereby set aside and dedicated in perpe-
tuity as a public park to be used by all the public for
recreational purposes.

Section 2. That the hereinafter described real property
be maintained as an underwater park and marine life reserve
in such a manner as shall insure that the total environment,
geological, biological, and botanical, of the area be preserved
and protected.

Section 3. That the hereinafter described real property
be, and the same is hereby named "San Diego La Jolla Underwater
Park."

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Section 4. That the real property so dedicated and named is described as follows:

All that portion of the Pacific Ocean and tide and submerged lands lying within the boundaries of the City of San Diego, County of San Diego, State of California, described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the Mean High Tide Line of the Pacific Ocean with the Northerly line of the Pueblo of San Diego as shown on the map of said Pueblo made by James Pascoe in the year 1870 and filed in the Office of the Recorder of said County as Miscellaneous Map No. 36; thence Westerly at right angles to the general run of shore, one and one-half statute miles to a point; thence South to a point from which the most Northerly projection of La Jolla Park bears South 45°00'00" East, said La Jolla Park being shown as Block 58 on the map of La Jolla Park filed in the Office of the Recorder of said County as Map No. 352; thence South 45°00'00" East in a direct line to said most Northerly point of said Block 58; thence in a generally Easterly direction following the meanderings of the bluffs of the Pacific Ocean at the Mean High Tide Line to the Southerly end of the beach known as La Jolla Shores; thence Northerly along the Mean High Tide Line of the Pacific Ocean to the Point of Beginning.

Excepting therefrom all that portion described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the said Mean High Tide Line and the Westerly prolongation of the Southerly line of Pueblo Lot 1298 of said Pueblo Lands of San Diego; thence Westerly along the said prolongation of said Southerly line of Pueblo Lot 1298 to the intersection of Longitude 117°16'15" West; thence due North along said Longitude Line to the intersection with Latitude 32°53'00" North; thence Easterly along said Latitude Line to the intersection with said Mean High Tide Line; thence Southerly along said Mean High Tide Line to the Point of Beginning.

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Section 5. That the City Manager is hereby directed to coordinate the operation of said San Diego La Jolla Underwater Park with the various State regulatory agencies, and specifically the California Department of Fish and Game, to the end that the total environment, geological, biological, and botanical, of the area be preserved and protected.

Section 6. That the City Clerk of said City be, and he is hereby directed to file for record in the Office of the Recorder of the County of San Diego, State of California, a certified copy of this ordinance.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage.

is the owner of certain tide and sub-
merged lands in the City of San Diego;
and

WHEREAS, It is the desire of the
people of the City of San Diego to
set aside and dedicate forever said
tide and submerged lands for public
use and enjoyment as and for a public
park to be used by all the public for
recreational uses; and

WHEREAS, It is the intent and the
purpose of the people of the City of
San Diego to maintain said park as
an underwater park and marine life
reserve to the end that the total
environment, geological, biological and
botanical, of the area be preserved
and protected; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council
of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the hereinafter de-
scribed real property be, and the same
is hereby set aside and dedicated in
perpetuity as a public park to be used
by all the public for recreational pur-
poses.

Section 2. That the hereinafter de-
scribed real property be maintained
as an underwater park and marine
life reserve in such a manner as shall
insure that the total environment,
geological, biological, and botanical,
of the area be preserved and protected.

Section 3. That the hereinafter de-
scribed real property be, and the same
is hereby named "San Diego La Jolla
Underwater Park."

Section 4. That the real property so
dedicated and named is described as
follows:

All that portion of the Pacific
Ocean and tide and submerged
lands lying within the boundaries
of the City of San Diego, County
of San Diego, State of California,
described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of
the Mean High Tide Line of the
Pacific Ocean with the Northeast-
erly line of the Pueblo of San
Diego as shown on the map of
said Pueblo made by James Pascoe
in the year 1870 and filed in the
Office of the Recorder of said
County as Miscellaneous Map No.
30; thence Westerly at right angle
to the general run of shore, one
and one-half statute miles to a
point; thence South to a point
from which the most Northerly
projection of La Jolla Park bears
South 45°00'42" East, said La Jolla
Park being shown as Block 58 on
the map of La Jolla Park filed in
the Office of the Recorder of said
County as Map No. 352; thence
South 45°00'00" East in a direct
line to said most Northerly point
of said Block 58; thence in a gen-
erally Easterly direction following
the meanderings of the bluffs of
the Pacific Ocean at the Mean High
Tide Line to the Southerly end
of the beach known as La Jolla
Shores; thence Northerly along
the Mean High Tide Line of the
Pacific Ocean to the Point of Be-
ginning.

Excepting therefrom all that por-
tion described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of
the said Mean High Tide Line and
the Westerly prolongation of the
Southerly line of Pueblo Lot 1298
of said Pueblo Lands of San Diego;
thence Westerly along the said
prolongation of said Southerly line
of Pueblo Lot 1298 to the inter-
section of Longitude 117°16'15"
West; thence due North along said
Longitude Line to the intersection
with Latitude 32°53'00" North;
thence Easterly along said Lat-
itude Line to the intersection

with said Mean High Tide Line;
thence Southerly along said Mean
High Tide Line to the Point of
Beginning.

Section 5. That the City Manager
is hereby directed to coordinate the
operation of said San Diego La Jolla
Underwater Park with the various
State regulatory agencies, and specific-
ally the California Department of Fish
and Game, to the end that the total
environment, geological, biological, and
botanical, of the area be preserved
and protected.

Section 6. That the City Clerk of
said City be, and he is hereby directed
to file for record in the Office of the
Recorder of the County of San Diego,
State of California, a certified copy
of this ordinance.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take
effect and be in force on the thirtieth
day from and after its passage.
