A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING AN UNDERGROUND UTILITY DISTRICT TO BE KNOWN AND DENOMINATED AS THE OLD TOWN SAN DIEGO UNDERGROUND UTILITY DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, by Resolution No.	1.99575	, a public
hearing was called for on	MAY 12 1970	at
the hour of 9:30 a.m. in the Coun	cil Chambers of	the City
Administration Building, 202 "C"	Street, San Diego	o,
California, to determine whether	the public healt	h, safety
or general welfare require the re	moval of poles,	overhead
wires and associated overhead str	uctures and the	underground
installation of wires and facilit	ies for supplyin	g electric,
communication, community antenna	television or si	milar or
associated service within that ce	rtain area of the	e City of
San Diego all as more particularl	y shown on that	certain map
entitled Old Town San Diego Under	ground Utility D	istrict
dated December 8, 1969, a copy of	which is on file	e in the
office of the City Clerk as Docum	ent No. '7316	<b>346</b> ; and

WHEREAS, notice of such hearing has been given by the City Clerk to all affected property owners as defined in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code, and the utilities concerned in the manner and for the time required by law; and

WHEREAS, such hearing has been duly and regularly held and all persons interested have been given an opportunity to be heard; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

(1) That the City Council does hereby find and determine that the public health, safety and general welfare require

the removal of poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, community antenna television or similar or associated service within the area set forth above and that pursuant to Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code, the above described area is hereby declared to be an underground utility district in the City of San Diego, and the map and document referred to above are hereby incorporated as a part of this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that pursuant to Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code the following exception shall be allowed in said underground utility district:

(1) Cable Pole No. C2880 serving the State Highway
Building, Lot 1, Block 407, Old San Diego Miscellaneous Map
No. 40.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council does hereby fix the date of October 15, 1970 as the date upon which the property in the District, as shown in Area B on the map referred to above, must be ready to receive underground service, and does hereby order the removal of all poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, community antenna television or similar or associated service within said District, as shown in Area B on said map, by March 1, 1971 .

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council does hereby fix the date of <u>December 1, 1970</u> as the date upon which the property in the District, as shown in Area C on the map referred to above, must be ready to receive underground service, and does hereby order the removal of

all poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, community antenna television or similar or associated service within said District, as shown in Area C on said map, by March 1, 1971

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to notify all affected persons as defined in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code, and all affected utility companies of the adoption of this resolution within ten (10) days after the date of such adoption. The City Clerk shall further notify said affected persons as defined in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code of the necessity that if they desire to continue to receive electric, communication, community antenna television or similar or associated service, they shall provide, at their own expense, all necessary facility changes on their premises so as to receive underground service from the lines relocated underground of the supplying utility company subject to applicable rules, regulations and tariffs of the respective utility company on file with the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California as of the date of adoption of this resolution and subject to all other applicable requirements of State law and City ordinances. The Clerk's notification shall be made in the manner provided in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council hereby finds that the underground utility district created herein is required by the public health, safety and general welfare for the following reason:

(1) Streets, road or right of ways adjoin or pass through a public recreation area and an area of unusual scenic interest to the general public.
