#### BACKGROUND

Heretofore, parking time limit and parking meter zones have been established only in commercial areas and fringes thereto. The non-utilization or lack of adequate off-street parking capacity now existing at a number of locations city-wide has resulted in certain residential areas being overrun by employee/student parkers. This long-term or "all-day" type of parking frequently occupies the entire street effectively denying the residents any use of same.

## PURPOSE

To formulate criteria used in establishing parking time limit zones in residential areas, and to assure complete and equitable treatment of all requests for same.

#### POLICY

It is the policy of the Council to consider the following criteria when establishing residential area parking time limit zones:

- a. Existing use of curb parking
- b. Traffic volume and patterns
- c. Enforcement problems relative to contiguity or isolation from other limited parking zones.
- d. Area affected (extent) and effect on nearby areas.

- e. Time limits to be used and hours effective--should closely parallel those zones now in operation and should be effective not less than five days a week (holidays excluded).
- f. Desires of adjacent property owners.

A survey for criteria data may be made upon the Council's initiative, the City Manager's initiative, or upon receipt of a petition representing at least <u>seventy-five percent</u> (75%) of the property frontage involved and signed by the owners thereof.

The results of such a survey is to be furnished to the Council by Report of the City Manager.
