WHEREAS, on March 15, 1962 the City Council adopted Resolution No. 169960 concerning a policy statement on annexations of areas to The City of San Diego; and

WHEREAS, that policy generally has placed the burden of initiation of annexation proceedings on property owners in the affected area; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of The City of San Diego that the existing policy be revised to reflect the advantages flowing to the public by the incorporation of islands into the City, the elimination of duplication of service areas and general establishment of logical boundaries even though the areas involved may be small; and

WHEREAS, in the cases above-mentioned it is in the public interest that The City of San Diego take the initiative in commencing annexations; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

- 1. Council Policy 600-1 regarding annexations be and is hereby amended as set forth in the form of Council Policy filed in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. 732246.
- 2. The City Clerk is hereby instructed to add the aforesaid policy to the Council Policy Manual.
- 3. Resolution No. 169960, adopted March 15, 1962 is hereby rescinded.

SUBJECT: ANNEXATIONS BY CITY

NUMBER: 600-1

BACKGROUND

During the 1950's and 1960's, The City of San Diego experienced a tremendous amount of growth in all areas of the City through annexations. The recent development of these new lands has stretched the resources of the City to a point where it is recognized that annexation for its own sake is not always in the best interest of the City. However, the present City boundaries are ill defined from the standpoint of logic concerning what could be ultimately the final boundaries. Such items as area drainage patterns, physical interrelationships between lands within present City boundaries and those outside and other similar things should be weighed and some preliminary planning done toward achieving the optimum City boundary.

PURPOSE

It is the purpose of this policy to facilitate the elimination of county islands, and to work toward the above-mentioned ultimate logical boundaries for the City by instructing the City staff to actively pursue annexation activity whenever these objectives will be achieved.

POLICY

It is the policy of the City Council that except as noted below, the annexation of any unincorporated territory to the City shall primarily be the responsibility of the citizens and/or property owners involved in the area proposed for annexation. However, in response to questions asked by any citizen or property owner interested in annexation, the City will furnish factual information regarding requirements of annexation and comparative costs insofar as possible.
