RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE CANVASS OF THE SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD ON JUNE 2, 1970, ON TWO PROPOSITIONS TO AMEND THE CITY CHARTER.

WHEREAS, this Council by Ordinance No. 10259 (New Series) adopted March 31, 1970, called a special municipal election to be held in the City on June 2, 1970; and

WHEREAS, this special municipal election was duly consolidated with the statewide primary election held upon the same date; and

WHEREAS, the special municipal election was held on June 2, 1970, for the purpose of proposing and submitting to the qualified electors of the City two propositions to amend the Charter of The City of San Diego as follows:

PROPOSITION A. CITY OF SAN DIEGO CHARTER AMENDMENT: AMEND SECTION 143 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO.

Amend Section 143 to delete language which prevents The City of San Diego from using alternate methods of funding its contributions for the retirement of members of the City Employees' Retirement System.

PROPOSITION B. CITY OF SAN DIEGO CHARTER AMENDMENT: ADD NEW SECTION 148.2 TO THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO.

Add new Section 148.2 to grant the City Council the power to adopt an ordinance providing for the establishment of reciprocal rights and benefits between the City Employees' Retirement System and members of other public employee retirement systems, provided that the Council first obtains the approval of a majority of all active members of the City Employees' Retirement System.

WHEREAS, a copy of the certificate of the Registrar of Voters of the County of San Diego canvassing the returns of the special municipal election, including absentee votes cast, as certified to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, has been duly received; and

WHEREAS, a canvass of the special municipal election has been completed and the City Clerk has certified the results to the City Council; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that the Council finds and determines pursuant to the provisions of Section 27.2206 of the San Diego Municipal Code as follows:

- 1. The total number of votes cast in the City, including absentee votes, is 165,627.
- 2. The number of votes, including absentee votes, cast for and against each of the two propositions which appeared on the ballot as propositions lettered A and B and the total number of votes cast upon each proposition, including absentee votes, are as follows:

PROPOSITION A:

PROPOSITION B:

Against	97,031

- 3. Propositions A and B did not receive the affirmative vote of a majority of the qualified voters voting on each proposition and each is hereby declared to have failed.
- 4. The number of votes cast, including absentee votes, is recorded in the Election Returns Book, which book is a part of the records of this Council.

5. The City Clerk shall make public the results of the canvass of the special municipal election by publication of a copy of this resolution.
