AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER IV,
ARTICLE 2 OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL
CODE BY AMENDING SECTION 42.0101.1
RELATING TO TRUCKS AND FOOD HANDLING
PERMITS.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of
San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter IV, Article 2 of the San Diego
Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended by amending
Section 42.0101.1 to read as follows:

SEC. 42.0101.1 FOOD HANDLING ESTABLISHMENTS--EXEMPT
VEHICLES AND VENDING MACHINES

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the following are
exempt from the permit and inspection requirements of
this Chapter and shall not be considered in determining
fees for Health Permits:

1. Wholesale and retail delivery trucks transporting
nonperishable previously inspected and packaged foods
or beverage products.
2. Wholesale and/or retail milk delivery trucks.
3. Wholesale delivery ice cream trucks.
4. Retail grocery delivery trucks.
5. Wholesale produce trucks.
6. Wholesale carbonated and alcoholic beverage
delivery trucks.
7. Wholesale and/or retail bottled water delivery
trucks.
8. Vending machines dispensing wrapped, canned or
bottled nonperishable foods or beverages.

9. Vehicles used to service vending machines dispensing prepackaged nonperishable food products obtained from a commissary or warehouse located within San Diego County.

10. Vessels under the jurisdiction of the United States Public Health Service.

A wholesale delivery truck is a vehicle that delivers food to a consumer, retailer or wholesaler pursuant to prior order; wholesale delivery truck does not include a vehicle from which selling is done directly by a driver, salesman or other person.

A retail delivery truck is any vehicle used for the transportation of food or beverage products which is not a wholesale delivery truck as defined herein.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage.
