herein, made a part of and attached to this resolution; and April 8, 1971 WHEREAS, at a meeting held on

the City Council of The City of San Diego adopted Resolution requesting the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego to order the consolidation of a special municipal election to be held on June 8, 1971, with the County Special Election to be held on the same date; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego is expected to grant the request and order the consolidation of the two elections; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

- 1. The Board of the San Diego Community College District is hereby requested in accordance with Section 23300 of the California Government Code to concur in the order consolidating the special municipal election to be held for the purpose of determining the opinion of the electorate on the question of whether or not the City Council of The City of San Diego should consider calling an election on the question "Shall a Charter Commission be elected to propose a new charter or to revise the current charter?" in the City of San Diego on June 8, 1971, with the County Special Election and the Community College District Election to be held on the same date.
- 2. The City Clerk is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this resolution with the Board of Supervisors and the Registrar of Voters of the County of San Diego and with the Board of the San Diego Community College District.

ORDINANCE NO. 10544 (New Series)

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA ORDERING, CALLING, PROVIDING FOR AND GIVING NOTICE OF A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY ON JUNE 8, 1971, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE CITY A PROPOSITION CALLING FOR THE OPINION OF THE ELECTORATE ON THE QUESTION OF WHETHER OR NOT THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO SHOULD CONSIDER CALLING AN ELECTION ON THE QUESTION "SHALL A CHARTER COMMISSION BE ELECTED TO PROPOSE A NEW CHARTER OR TO REVISE THE CURRENT CHARTER?", CONSOLIDATING SUCH ELECTION WITH THE COUNTY SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE SAME DATE.

WHEREAS, at a meeting held on April 8, 1971

the City Council of The City of San Diego adopted Resolution

No. 202381 requesting the Board of Supervisors of

The County of San Diego to order the consolidation of a

special municipal election to be held on June 8, 1971, with

the County Special Election to be held on the same date; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego is expected to grant the request and order the consolidation of the two elections; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, California, as follows:

Section 1. A special municipal election is hereby called and ordered to be held in the City of San Diego, California on June 8, 1971; and the Council of The City of San Diego being the legislative body thereof, hereby proposes and submits to the qualified voters of the City at such special municipal election, the following proposition:

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PROPOSITION	
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Soliciting the opinion of the people of San Diego on the Question:

Shall the City Council of The City of San Diego consider calling an election on the question "Shall a Charter Commission be elected to propose a new charter or to revise the current charter?"?

Section 2. This proposition shall be presented and printed upon the ballot and submitted to the voters in the manner and form set out in Section 4 of this ordinance.

Section 3. The polls for this special municipal election shall be open at 7 a.m. (local time) on June 8, 1971, and shall remain open continuously until 8 p.m. (local time) on the same day at which time the polls shall be closed, except as provided in Section 14436 of the Elections Code of the State of California.

Section 4. Since this election is being consolidated with the County Special Election; and since the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego is hereby authorized to canvass returns of this election; and since only one form of ballot is authorized, the method of voting upon these propositions shall be as provided in the Elections Code of the State of California; and, on the ballots to be used at this special municipal election, in addition to any other matters required by law, there shall be printed substantially the following:

MARK DOTS (O) ON THE BALLOT ONLY WITH RUBBER STAMP: NEVER WITH PEN OR PENCIL.

(ABSENTEE BALLOTS MAY BE MARKED WITH PEH AND INK OR PENCIL.)

INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTERS

To vote on any measure, stamp a dot (②) in the voting square after the word "YES" or after the word "NO." All marks, except the dot (③) are forbidden and make the ballot void.

If you wrongly stamp, tear or deface this ballot, return it to the inspector of election and obtain another.

On absentee voter's ballots mark a dot (©) with pen or pencil.

Section 5. A dot (①) placed in the voting square after the word "YES," in the manner hereinbefore provided, shall be counted in favor of the adoption of the proposition. A dot (②) placed in the voting square after the word "NO," in the manner hereinbefore provided, shall be counted against the adoption of the proposition.

Section 6. The special municipal election called for June 8, 1971, in the City of San Diego is hereby ordered consolidated with the County Special Election to be held on the same date. Within the City of San Diego the precincts, polling places and officers of the election for the special municipal election shall be the same as those provided for in the County Special Election, all as set forth in the List of Election Officers and Polling Places for the County Special Election proposed to be published in the San Diego Union.

Section 7. The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego is hereby authorized to canvass the returns of the special municipal election and these elections shall be held in all respects as if there were only one election, and within the City only one form of ballot shall be used. The Board of Supervisors shall certify the results of the canvass of the returns of this special municipal election to the Council of The City of San Diego which shall then declare the results of the election.

Section 8. The proposition submitted by this ordinance shall be designated on the ballot by a letter printed on the left margin of the square containing the description of the measure as provided in Section 10231 of the Elections Code of the State of California.

Section 9. Except as otherwise provided in this ordinance, the special municipal election shall be conducted as provided by law for other municipal elections of the City.

Section 10. The City Clerk shall cause this ordinance to be published once in the official newspaper not less than 40 nor more than 60 days before the date of the election. No other notice of the election need be given.

Section 11. This ordinance shall take effect on

April 8, 1971 , being the day of its introduction and passage.
