A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING AN UNDERGROUND UTILITY DISTRICT TO BE KNOWN AND DENOMINATED AS THE UNIVERSITY AVENUE - COLLEGE AVENUE TO 69TH STREET - UNDERGROUND UTILITY DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 203205, a public hearing was called for on JULY 20, 1971 at the hour of 9:30 a.m. in the Council Chamber of the City Administration Building, 202 C Street, San Diego, California, to determine whether the public health, safety or general welfare require the removal of poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, community antenna television or similar or associated service within that certain area of the City of San Diego more particularly described as follows:

That portion of Parcel "00," Lot 19, Rancho Mission, S.C.C. 12524, lying between a line 200 feet easterly of the east line of College Avenue and the westerly line of Rolando Shopping Center, Map No. 3233, and between the southerly line of University Avenue and a line parallel to and 25 feet southerly of the southerly line of University Avenue; the northerly 25 feet of Record of Survey 2218; the northerly 25 feet of Bonillo Square, Map No. 3571; the northerly 25 feet of Rolando Shopping Center, Map No. 3233; the northerly 25 feet of Lot 1, Aragon Heights Unit No. 1; Map No. 4227; the northerly 50 feet of Lot 3, Aragon Heights Unit No. 1, Map No. 4227; and the southerly 25 feet of Benmar Addition, Map No. 4374;

said district shall include the following described public right of way:

UNIVERSITY AVENUE between a line 200 feet easterly of the east line of College Avenue and the easterly City limits along the easterly line of 69th Street; and BONILLO DRIVE between the southerly line of University Avenue and the westerly prolongation of the southerly line of Lot 5, Bonillo Square, Map No. 3571;

and all as more particularly shown on that certain map entitled "UNIVERSITY AVENUE - COLLEGE AVENUE TO 69TH STREET - UNDERGROUND UTILITY DISTRICT," dated June 28, 1971, a copy of which is on file in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. 736608 and attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, notice of such hearing has been given by the City Clerk to all affected property owners as defined in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code, and the utilities concerned in the manner and for the time required by law; and

WHEREAS, such hearing has been duly and regularly held and all persons interested have been given an opportunity to be heard; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

1. The City Council does hereby find and determine that the public health, safety and general welfare require the removal of poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, community antenna television or similar or associated service within

the area set forth above and that pursuant to Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code, the above-described area is hereby declared to be an underground utility district in the City of San Diego, and the map and document referred to above are hereby incorporated as a part of this resolution.

2. Pursuant to Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code the following exception shall be allowed in said underground utility district:

The two existing poles located at the intersection of 69th Street and University Avenue. These two poles are tied to the County's overhead system running easterly on University Avenue from the intersection at 69th Street. The County has established a priority for undergrounding University Avenue easterly of the City limits at 69th Street. These two poles will be removed as a part of the County's project.

3. The City Council does hereby fix the date of September 1, 1972 as the date upon which the property in the District must be ready to receive underground service, and does hereby order the removal of all poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, community antenna

television or similar or associated service within said District by November 6, 1972.

4. The City Clerk be, and he is hereby instructed to notify all affected persons as defined in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code, and all affected utility companies of the adoption of this resolution within ten (10) days after the date of such adoption. The City Clerk shall further notify said affected persons as defined in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code of the necessity that if they desire to continue to receive electric, communication, community antenna television or similar or associated service, they shall provide, at their own expense, all necessary facility changes on their premises so as to receive underground service from the lines relocated underground of the supplying utility company subject to applicable rules, regulations and tariffs of the respective utility company on file with the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California as of the date of adoption of this resolution and subject to all other applicable requirements of State law and City ordinances. The Clerk's notification shall be made in the manner provided in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code.

5. The City Council hereby finds that the underground utility district created herein is required by the public

health, safety and general welfare for the following reason:

This street is extensively used by the  
general public and carries a heavy volume of  
pedestrian and vehicular traffic.

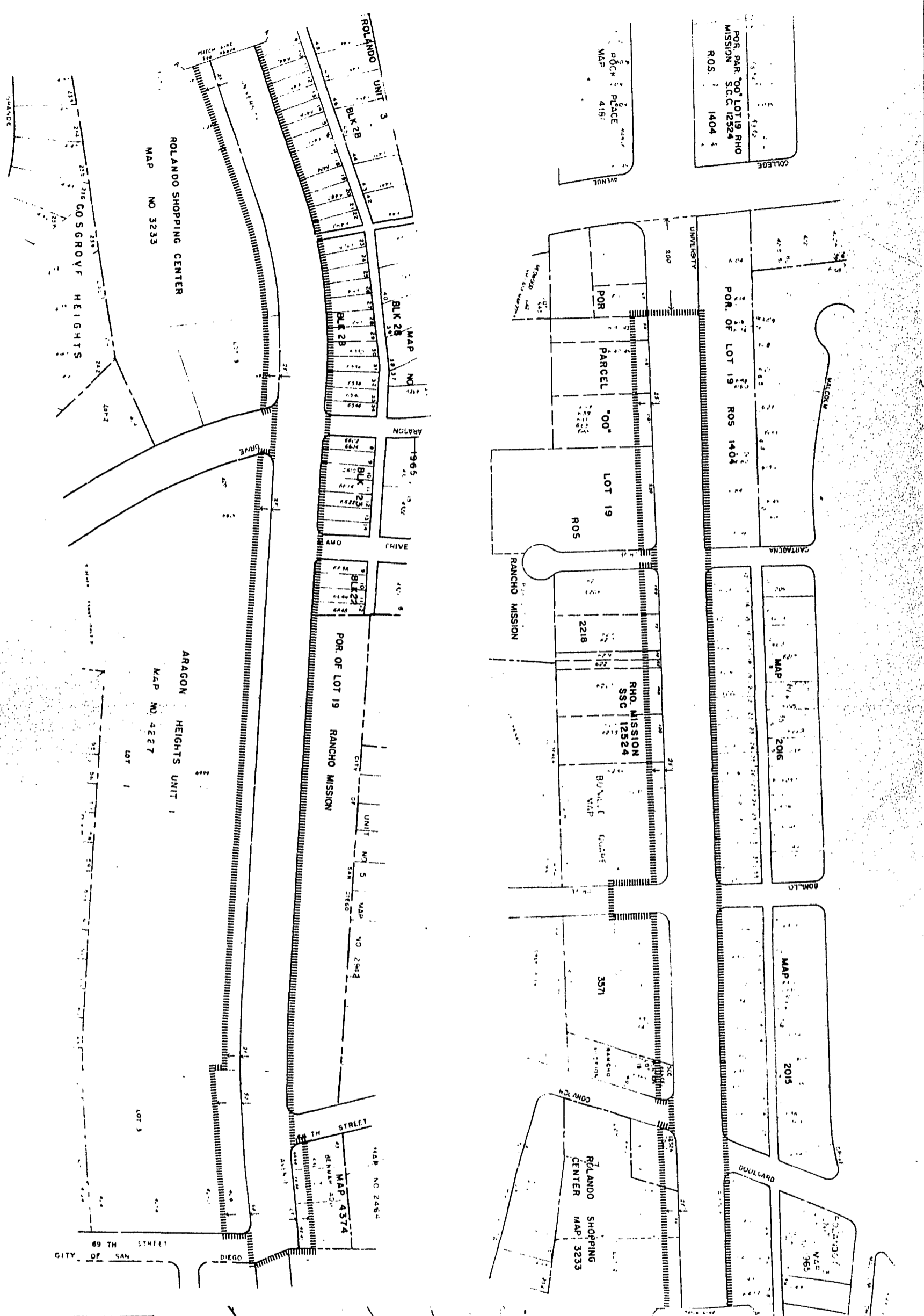

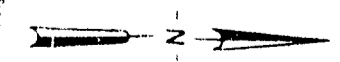

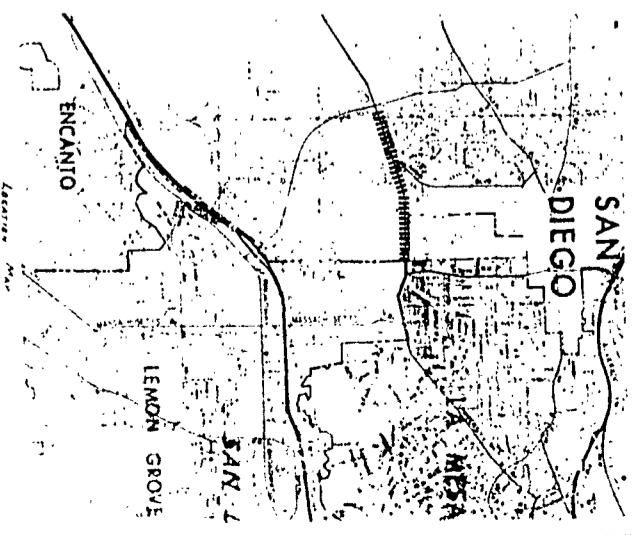
