RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO.

TO ESTABLISH THE DOWNTOWN STREET TREE MAINTENANCE DISTRICT.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of The City of
San Diego proposes and intends to establish a street tree
maintenance district to pay the costs of maintenance of
all trees, shrubs, plants, etc., planted or placed within
the public rights-of-way or public easements located
within the boundaries of the district hereinafter
described in said City under the provisions of the San
Diego Maintenance District Procedural Ordinance of 1969,
authorized by Article XIII, Section 17 of the California
Constitution and provided for in Sections 65.0201 through
65.0244 of the San Diego Municipal Code. Such maintenance
being particularly described as follows:

Section 1

DESCRIPTION OF MAINTENANCE

The proposed street tree maintenance consists in general of the following:

- a. Irrigation, fertilization and pruning and/or shaping of trees and shrubs.
- b. Removal of weeds, trash and litter from planter boxes and tree wells.
- c. Replacement of dead or diseased trees and shrubs.

- d. Repair of equipment and facilities.
- e. Pest control.

The maintenance to be performed in the Centre City
Way Zone consists of:

- a. Periodic sweeping and scrubbing of sidewalk areas.
- b. Cleaning and maintenance of street furniture, drinking fountains, kiosks and trash receptacles.
- c. Repair and maintenance of irrigation system and ornamental fountains.
- d. Replacement of annual plants.
- e. Irrigation, fertilization and pruning of trees, shrubs and plants in planter areas.

The maintenance shall be for a period commencing with the formation of the district and ending on June 30, 1972.

Section 2

DESCRIPTION OF MAINTENANCE DISTRICT

The expenses of the contemplated maintenance hereinbefore mentioned are made chargeable upon the district hereinafter described, and the Council does declare said district to be the district benefited by the maintenance, and to be assessed to pay the costs and expenses thereof. The district is described as follows:

Section 3

ASSESSMENT OF COST AND EXPENSE

It is proposed to assess the total amount of the maintenance costs of the district, plus the incidental expenses thereto, to all the real property within the district in conformance with the provisions of the San Diego Maintenance District Procedural Ordinance of 1969 and in proportion to the estimated benefits from the maintenance to be received by the individual parcels of real property.

The Council may order a portion of the costs of maintenance to be paid by the City from appropriate funds.

A statement of the proposed assessments levied against the several lots or parcels of land as shown on the map referred to in Section 2 above, is on file in the office of the Street Superintendent for public inspection. Assessments will be levied pursuant to Chapter VI, Article 5, Division 2, of the San Diego Municipal Code.

Section 4

SPECIAL ZONES

It is proposed to create, within the overall maintenance district, a special zone as shown on the assessment diagram, said special zone containing facilities which require special maintenance in addition to that provided generally by the district. That property shown within the special zone has been determined to receive increased benefit from said

special maintenance and the assessment levied within the special zone is commensurate with that benefit.

Section 5

TIME AND PLACE OF HEARING

Such protest, if any, must be in writing and must contain a description of the property in which each signer thereof is interested, sufficient to identify the same and shall be delivered to and filed with the City Clerk at a time no later than the hour set for the hearing.

Section 6

PUBLICATION OF NOTICE

The City Clerk is directed to cause a notice, entitled "Notice of Maintenance District," published at least ten days before the date of the hearing in the San Diego Daily Transcript.

The City Clerk is directed to mail a copy of such notice, postage prepaid, to all persons owning real property proposed to be assessed, whose names and addresses appear on the last equalized County Assessment Roll, all in the manner provided for in the San Diego Maintenance District Procedural Ordinance of 1969.
