ORDINANCE NO. 10790
(New Series)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER II, ARTICLE 2,
OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY ADDING
DIVISION 19, SECTION 22.1901, RELATING TO
THE DEPARTMENT OF LEGISLATIVE REPRESENTATION.

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 9633 (New Series) establishing a
Legislative Representation Department was passed and adopted
on May 25, 1967; and

WHEREAS, Council Resolution No. 196944, adopted May 15,
1969, created the Committee on Legislation and Intergovernmental
Affairs to be responsible for considering and advising the
Council of all Federal and State legislation or proposed
legislation; and

WHEREAS, legislative representation is an extension of
the Council's legislative desires and is a matter of concern
most properly allocated to the Mayor and Council as primary
spokesmen for and policy makers on behalf of the electorate; and

WHEREAS, the Council is desirous of assigning responsibility
for and administration of the Department of Legislative Repre-
sentation to the Mayor as permanent Chairman of the Committee
on Legislation and Intergovernmental Affairs; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego,
as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter II, Article 2 of the San Diego
Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended by adding
Division 19, Section 22.1901 to read as follows:

Legislative Representation Department

SEC. 22.1901 DEPARTMENT OF LEGISLATIVE REPRESENTATION

The Department of Legislative Representation is a City department. The Director is the administrative head of the department and shall be appointed by the Mayor subject to confirmation by a majority of the Council. The Director shall, under direction of the Mayor, be responsible for planning, recommending, coordinating and administering a State and Federal legislative program for The City of San Diego. The department shall, under direction of the Mayor and Council Committee on Legislation and Intergovernmental Affairs, and in consultation with City departments and other sources:

- (1) Develop for City Council approval City legislative programs for the State and Federal legislative sessions.
- (2) Represent the City before State and Federal legislative and administrative bodies.
- (3) Analyze and submit reports on State and Federal legislation affecting the City.
- (4) Maintain liaison with and assist the City's State and Federal legislative delegations in any matter of interest to the City.
- (5) Perform related work as directed.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage.



WHEREAS Ordinance No. 9638 (New Series) establishing a Legislative Representation Department was passed and adopted on May 25, 1967, and

WHEREAS Council Resolution No. 19845 adopted May 16, 1969, created the Committee on Legislation and Intergovernmental Affairs to be responsible for considering and advising the Council on all Federal and State legislation or proposed legislation; and

WHEREAS legislative representation is an extension of the Council's legislative desires and is a matter of responsibility presently allocated to the Mayor and Council and primary spokesmen and policy makers on behalf of the electorate;

WHEREAS the Council is desirous of assigning responsibility for and administration of the Department of Legislative Representation to the Mayor and Council Chairman of the Committee on Legislation and Intergovernmental Affairs; NOW, THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDAINED by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:
Section 2. That Chapter II, Article 2 of the San Diego Municipal Code, as amended, is hereby amended to add Division 18, Section 22.1001, which follows:

22.1001 DEPARTMENT OF LEGISLATIVE REPRESENTATION

The Department of Legislative Representation is a City department. The Director is the administrative head of the department and shall be appointed by the Mayor subject to confirmation by a majority of the Council. The Director shall be under the direction of the Mayor and shall be responsible for planning, organizing, coordinating and administering the State and Federal legislative program for the City of San Diego. The Department shall under the direction of the Mayor and Council Committee on Legislation and Intergovernmental Affairs, and in consultation with City departments and other sources:

- (1) Develop for City Council approval City legislative programs for the State and Federal legislative sessions.
- (2) Represent the City before State and Federal legislative and administrative bodies.
- (3) Analyze and submit reports on State and Federal legislation affecting the City.
- (4) Maintain liaison with and assist the City's State and Federal legislative delegations in any matter of interest to the City.
- (5) Perform related work as directed.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage.
