RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE CANVASS OF THE SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD ON JUNE 6, 1972 ON TWO PROPOSITIONS TO AMEND THE CITY CHARTER.

WHEREAS, this Council by Ordinance No. 10803 (New Series) adopted March 21, 1972, called a special municipal election to be held in the City on June 6, 1972; and

WHEREAS, this special municipal election was duly consolidated with the statewide primary election held upon the same date; and

WHEREAS, the special municipal election was held on June 6, 1972, for the purpose of proposing and submitting to the qualified electors of the City two propositions to amend the Charter of The City of San Diego as follows:

PROPOSITION A. CITY OF SAN DIEGO CHARTER AMENDMENT. ADDS SECTION 103.1a TO THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO.

Shall an Environmental Growth Fund be created which sets aside twenty-five (25) percent of revenues collected from franchises for the transmission and distribution of gas, electricity and steam to be used two-thirds for debt service on bonds of any nature which are subsequently authorized to acquire open space for park or recreational purposes and the remaining for the preservation and enhancement of the environment of the City of San Diego? If no such bonds are subsequently issued, the entire Environmental Growth Fund must be used exclusively for the preservation and enhancement of the environment of the City of San Diego.

PROPOSITION B. CITY OF SAN DIEGO CHARTER AMENDMENT. AMEND SECTION 12 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO.

Amend Section 12 to provide that the rate of pay for each Councilman shall be Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) per month.

WHEREAS, a copy of the certificate of the Registrar of Voters of the County of San Diego canvassing the returns of the special municipal election, including absentee votes cast, as certified to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, has been duly received; and

WHEREAS, a canvass of the special municipal election has been completed and the City Clerk has certified the results to the City Council; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that the Council finds and determines pursuant to the provisions of Section 27.2206 of the San Diego Municipal Code as follows:

- 1. The total number of votes cast in the City, including absentee votes is 237,428.
- 2. The number of votes, including absentee votes, cast for and against each of the two propositions which appeared on the ballot as propositions lettered A and B and the total number of votes cast upon each proposition, including absentee votes, are as follows:

PROPOSITION A:

For 113,510

Against 99,392

Total 212,902

PROPOSITION B:

For 90,334

Against 125,348

Total 215,682

- 3. Proposition A received the affirmative vote of a majority of the qualified voters voting on said proposition and is hereby declared to have been approved. Proposition B did not receive the affirmative vote of a majority of the qualified voters voting on such proposition and is hereby declared to have failed.
- 4. The number of votes cast, including absentee votes, is recorded in the Election Returns Book, which book is a part of the records of this Council.
- 5. The City Clerk shall make public the results of the canvass of the special municipal election by publication of a copy of this resolution.
