WHEREAS, DR. AND MRS. D. H. BESSESEN, individuals, Owners, and VIEWPOINT, a proposed joint venture, hereafter referred to as "Permittee," filed an application for a permit to construct a planned residential development, located on the South side of Hillside Drive, between Castellana Road and Via Siena, more particularly described as portions of Lots 61 and 63 and Lot 62, La Jolla Hills, Map No. 1749; portions of Lots A, C, D, Resub of La Jolla Hills No. 2, Map No. 2087, in the R-1-5 and R-1-5 (LC overlay) Zones; and

RESOLUTION NO.

WHEREAS, on June 7, 1972, the Planning Commission of The City of San Diego made its findings of facts, and denied Planned Residential Development Permit No. 56 and filed the same in the office of the City Clerk on June 15, 1972; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Section 101.0900 of the San Diego Municipal Code, LA JOLLA VIEWPOINT, LTD., by Ronald Reynolds, under date of June 26, 1972, appealed the decision of the Planning Commission; and

WHEREAS, said appeal was set for public hearing on August 1, 1972, testimony having been heard, evidence having been submitted and the City Council having fully considered the matter and being fully advised concerning the same; and

WHEREAS, the City Council in considering said appeal is empowered by the provisions of Municipal Code Section 101.0900, paragraph G.3., to affirm, reverse, or modify in whole or in part any determination of the Planning Commission, subject to the limitations as are placed upon the Planning Commission by the Municipal Code; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

All of the following facts exist with respect to Planned Residential Development Permit No. 56.

- 1. The proposed use at the particular location is not necessary to provide a facility which will contribute to the general well-being of the community.
- 2. Such use will, under the circumstances of the particular case, be detrimental to the health, safety or general welfare of persons residing or working in the vicinity, or injurious to property or improvements in the vicinity.
- 3. All design criteria and minimum standards for a Planned Residential Development will not be met.
- 4. The granting of this permit will adversely affect the General Plan of The City of San Diego or the adopted plan of any governmental agency.

The above findings are further supported by the minutes, tape of the proceedings, maps and exhibits, all of which are herein incorporated by reference.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that by a vote of 9 to 0 the appeal of LA JOLLA VIEWPOINT, LTD., is hereby denied and said Planned Residential Development Permit No. 56 is hereby denied.
