RESOLUTION NO. 208566 AUG 7 1973

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING AN UNDERGROUND UTILITY DISTRICT TO BE KNOWN AND DENOMINATED AS THE ULRIC STREET, FRIARS ROAD TO TAIT STREET, UNDERGROUND UTILITY DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 208363 , a public hearing was called for on AUG 71973 , at the hour of 9:30 a.m. in the Council Chamber of the City Administration Building, 202 "C" Street, San Diego, California, to determine whether the public health, safety or general welfare requires the removal of poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, community antenna television or similar or associated service within that certain area of the City of San Diego more particularly described as follows:

Lot 106, Mission Heights, Map No. 3142.

Said district shall include the following described public rights of way:

ULRIC STREET between the southerly line of Tait Street and the westerly prolongation of the southerly line of Mission Heights, Map No. 3142. LINDBROOK STREET between the northerly line of Ulric Street and the northerly prolongation of the easterly line of Lot 63, Mission Heights, Map No. 3142,

and all as more particularly shown on Drawing No. 15716-D, entitled ULRIC STREET, FRIARS ROAD TO TAIT STREET, UNDERGROUND UTILITY DISTRICT, copies of which are on file in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. 744038 and attached

hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, notice of such hearing has been given by the City Clerk to all affected property owners as defined in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code, and the utilities concerned in the manner and for the time required by law; and

WHEREAS, such hearing has been duly and regularly held and all persons interested have been given an opportunity to be heard; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

- 1. The City Council does hereby find and determine that the public health, safety and general welfare require the removal of poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, community antenna television or similar or associated service within the area set forth above and that pursuant to Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code, the above described area is hereby declared to be an underground utility district in the City of San Diego, and the map and document referred to above are hereby incorporated as a part of this resolution.
- 2. The City Council does hereby order the removal of all poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, community antenna television or similar or associated service within said District. The date

upon which property in the District must be ready to receive underground service, and for removal of all poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures shall be fixed and designated by a subsequent resolution, all as set forth in Section 61.0508, San Diego Municipal Code.

- 3. Notice of the adoption of the resolution fixing the time within which conversions on private property and pole removal must be accomplished shall be given by the City Clerk and City Manager in accordance with Section 61.0511(b) of the San Diego Municipal Code.
- 4. The City Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to notify all affected persons as defined in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code and all affected utility companies of the adoption of this Resolution No.

208566 within fifteen (15) days after the date of such adoption. The City Clerk specifically shall notify the affected persons that if they desire to continue to receive electric, communication, community antenna television or similar associated service, they shall provide at their own expense all necessary facility changes on their premises so as to receive underground service from the lines relocated underground of the supplying utility company subject to applicable rules, regulations and tariffs of the respective utility company on file with the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California (as of the date of adoption of this resolution) and subject to all other applicable requirements of state law and City ordinances. The Clerk's notification shall be made in the manner provided

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in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code.

5. The City Council hereby finds that the underground utility district created herein is required by the public health, safety and general welfare for the following reason:

This street is extensively used by the general public and carries a heavy volume of pedestrian and vehicular traffic.


