

RESOLUTION NO. 208982 OCT 9 1973

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE MUNICIPAL PRIMARY ELECTION AND THE SPECIAL MUNICIPAL BOND ELECTION HELD IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, IN THE SAN DIEGO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, AND IN THE SAN DIEGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT, ON SEPTEMBER 18, 1973.

WHEREAS, a municipal primary election was held in the City of San Diego, the San Diego Unified School District, and the San Diego Community College District, on Tuesday, September 18, 1973, pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 11090 (New Series) for the purpose of nominating candidates; and

WHEREAS, a special municipal bond election was held in the City of San Diego on the same date, pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance Nos. 11098 (New Series) and 11099 (New Series) adopted July 12, 1973, which special election was consolidated with the municipal primary election for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City of San Diego two propositions to incur indebtedness and issue bonds in the principal amount indicated therein as follows:

PROPOSITION A

PROPOSITION A. CITY OF SAN DIEGO PARKS AND RECREATION FACILITIES BOND PROPOSAL: Shall the City incur a bonded indebtedness in the principal amount of twenty-five million dollars (\$25,000,000) to permit the acquisition, construction and completion of parks, beaches and other recreational facilities, with sixty-nine percent (69%) of the total bonds authorized to be allocated for neighborhood and community parks, beaches and other recreational facilities, eighteen percent (18%) to be allocated for Balboa Park and thirteen percent (13%) for Mission Bay Park? CITY OF SAN DIEGO PARK RESERVE BOND PROPOSITION:</p> <p>Two-thirds (2/3) of the City's Environmental Growth Fund, derived from gas and electric franchise fees, must be used to pay debt service on bonds used to acquire, improve, or maintain park reserve lands for park and recreation purposes.</p>	<p>YES</p>	
<p>Shall the City incur a general obligation bonded indebtedness in the principal amount of twenty-two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$22,500,000) for the acquisition and improvement of Park Reserve lands, <u>pledging in payment of principal and interest thereon two-thirds (2/3) of the Environmental Growth Fund</u> authorized by the Charter of The City of San Diego?</p>	<p>NO</p>	

WHEREAS, a copy of the certificate of the Registrar of Voters of San Diego County canvassing the returns of the municipal primary election, and the special municipal bond election, as certified to the City Clerk, has been duly received; and

WHEREAS, a canvass of these elections has been completed and the City Clerk has certified the results to the City Council; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that the Council finds and determines, pursuant to the provisions of Section 27.2206 of the San Diego Municipal Code, as follows:

The whole number of votes cast in the City was 116,425.
