Police Department storage provides for only one grade of gasoline, and this has always been the premium grade. When Mr. Burns was Equipment Maintenance Foreman, he began consideration of the possibility of changing to the use of regular gasoline. He knew that current engine specifications, in respect to carburetors, compression and other features, were capable of using regular gas more satisfactorily. He also felt that regular gasoline, being of lower octane rating and much lower lead content, would be a real contribution to reducing air pollution. The change to regular gas was made in July, and it is estimated this will save \$40,000 per year based on the forecast consumption for this fiscal year.

Officer Sammons was concerned about the amount of time consumed in impounding vehicles found in violation of tow-away zones where street sweeping operations were scheduled. He made a three-part suggestion to improve the situation which was at first rejected. A few months later it was decided to adopt the part of his suggestion to issue citations instead of impounding vehicles in violation. This has been found to be satisfactory, and saves one-fourth of the time of a Police Officer amounting to about \$3,300 per year.

The Police Department receives many commendations from the public each year for the service rendered by members of the department. The former procedure for handling these required seven or eight steps, depending on whether officers involved were named. Ms. Kingsbury developed a new procedure involving only four or five steps, saving \$1,500 worth of clerical work per year.
