WHEREAS, the United States Congress in 1966 (PL 89-640) authorized a joint project between the United States and Mexico for flood control on the Tia Juana River; and

WHEREAS, construction of the Tia Juana River Flood Control Project has been authorized by the California Legislature (Water Code Section 12744, et seq.); and

WHEREAS, the project as authorized would construct a concrete-lined channel along the southerly edge of the Tia Juana River Valley from the international border at San Ysidro to the Pacific Ocean; and

WHEREAS, the draft environmental impact statement for the project, prepared (1971) for the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers by Ocean Science and Engineering, Inc., raised questions about possible adverse effects which would result from construction of a lined channel; and

WHEREAS, the San Diego County Comprehensive Planning
Organization, during the course of its clearinghouse review of
the draft environmental impact statement, expressed concern
about possible adverse effects from construction of a lined
flood control channel and urged that the Border Plan be
reevaluated and a study conducted to determine the value of
the estuary as a regional resource; and

WHEREAS, the Report on Flood Control - Tijuana River Basin, California, prepared by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers under

date of May 1, 1964, as amended July 9, 1965, and which was the basis for Congressional authorization of the flood control project, does not present a thorough analysis of the alternatives to a concrete-lined channel; and

WHEREAS, the Border Plan recommended development of an international border park in the Tia Juana River Valley, and the Federal Government has conveyed to the State of California, for park and recreation purposes, the former United States Navy Border Field Facility as an initial step in implementing this recommendation; and

WHEREAS, the State of California Resources Agency, in response to Assembly Concurrent Resolution No. 65, prepared a review report of land uses in the Tia Juana Valley, and said report recommended that the lower Tia Juana Valley be preserved, especially the estuary and the beach areas; that the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers abandon the concrete flood control channel concept; and that the State of California and local governmental bodies explore alternatives for acquisition of an enlarged border area park; and

WHEREAS, this Council, by Resolution No. 204491 on

December 21, 1971, withdrew support for the authorized project,
requesting the International Boundary and Water Commission to
develop feasible alternatives to the concrete-lined channel and
directed City staff to participate with the California Resources
Agency and other affected governmental agencies in a review and
update of the Border Area Plan as approved by Council on

November 9, 1967; and

WHEREAS, City staff, in response to Council direction, prepared a report on Tia Juana River Valley Land Use and Flood Control Alternatives (based on alternatives proposed by the International Boundary and Water Commission in its letter of February 5, 1972), which report was issued in May, 1973 and recommended a flood control facility which would retain the eastern part of the valley largely for agricultural use and allow preservation of most of the western portion in its natural state; and

WHEREAS, this Council, in conference on July 13, 1973, and in public hearings on July 24 and August 23, considered the various alternatives; and, following extensive public testimony, the Council, by Resolution No. 208684, approved the land use and flood control alternative described and identified in the above-mentioned report as "Alternative III-A"; and

WHEREAS, the International Boundary and Water Commission, in recognition of the construction schedule of channel improvements within the City of Tijuana, now estimated to be completed in the fall of 1974, requested the City Council to express by resolution its preference for a flood control facility on the Tia Juana River within the United States; and

WHEREAS, in response to the above request, the Council, by Resolution No. 209127 on October 30, 1973, informed the International Boundary and Water Commission that The City of San Diego supports the flood control facility described and identified in the report entitled "Tia Juana River Valley Land

MICRAFILMED 210593 Use and Flood Control Alternatives," May, 1973, as
Alternative III-A, and, in particular, the southerly alignment
of this facility, as proposed in the Commission's letter of
February 5, 1972; and further requested the Commission to
provide at an early date the necessary construction drawings,
environmental impact statement and right of way acquisition
plats necessary to proceed with a project to provide the flood
control facility described above; and

WHEREAS, the State of California Resources Agency and the Department of Water Resources have reviewed this alternative, and have determined that the differences between it and the authorized project are such that reauthorization should be sought; and

WHEREAS, the construction schedule of channel improvements within the City of Tijuana, scheduled for completion in the fall of 1974, requires immediate action to fulfill the international treaty obligations; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that this Council requests the State of California Legislature to reauthorize this project to conform to the flood control facility with sedimentation area as described in Alternative III-A, and to authorize the expenditure of the necessary monies for right of way acquisition and relocations.
