Minimum School Enrollment and Population Criteria Necessary to Open School Playgrounds

Existing

Criteria to use to determine whether or not a recreation program should be conducted at specific school playground locations consist basically of the factors of school enrollment and general population served by the facility. Based on national standards, a service area having a radius of one-half mile around a school location has been established. Within this area there must be a minimum population of 3,000. The second factor, school enrollment, must meet a minimum of 500. Because school playgrounds are operated primarily to serve the children who are enrolled in and live near the school playground, and secondarily to serve older children and adults living in the area, a weighting of the factors is used. The school enrollment has been assigned a weight of 75% and the general population has been assigned a weight of 25%. Using the minimum figures discussed above and the weighting factors, a total point rating of 1,125 is obtained as follows:

75% of 500 = 375

 $25\% \text{ of } 3,000 = \frac{750}{1,125}$

Existing

This establishes the minimum number of points that a school playground location must have in order to be considered as a new location to be opened for operation. Flexibility is provided by virtue of the fact that one factor may be low and the other high but a minimum point rating can still result.

Addition

In order to permit the year-round operation of elementary school playgrounds in those community areas which do not meet the above criteria because they are geographically isolated, lack other recreational opportunities, or are economically disadvantaged, the following criteria are established:

- a) The area to be serviced by the school playground is removed/isolated, (i.e., by freeways, canyons, natural or man-made boundaries, etc.,) from other municipal recreation services within a one-mile radius, and;
- b) The most recent census tract data indicates the surrounding community area's median family income is below that of the entire City.

Existing

Unusual factors should be considered. For example, special consideration must be shown if there is a non-public school located in the service area of a public school. Also, an outlying school, wherein the children are isolated from other public recreation activities sponsored by the city, may be opened for the summer period only even though below the minimum criteria.
