Pursuant to Section 66.0125(B) of the San Diego Municipal Code, the City Manager is hereby authorized to establish fees and regulations relating to sanitary landfill refuse disposal areas, as set forth in the fee schedule and regulations on file in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. 748076; said fee schedule and regulations to become effective on September 1, 1974.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Resolution No. 203071, adopted on July 1, 1971, shall be rescinded as of September 1, 1974.

FEE SCHEDULE AND REGULATIONS
FOR USE OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO
SANITARY LANDFILL REFUSE DISPOSAL AREAS

The following fee schedule is hereby established, and shall apply to designated City sanitary landfill refuse disposal areas (hereinafter called "landfills"), effective September 1, 1974. (This supersedes the schedule of July 1, 1971.)

FEES APPLICABLE TO:

- (1) All vehicles hauling solid waste, any portion of which is generated outside City limits.
- (2) All demolition, special handling and special surcharge handling, solid waste generated within and outside the City limits.

FEE EXEMPTIONS FOR WASTES GENERATED WITHIN THE CITY:

No vehicle or special handling fee shall be applied for certain wastes generated within the City as follows:

- (1) Garbage: Kitchen and table refuse consisting of decomposable animal, fish, fowl and vegetable matter.
- (2) Market refuse: Decomposable animal, fish, fowl, fruit and vegetable matter from markets and produce houses.
- (3) Dead animals; manure.
- (4) Ashes. (Ashes shall be wet. Dry ashes will not be accepted.)
- (5) Household waste: A load of waste that has the appearance of coming from a household. Such a load typically is contained in a vehicle of 3/4 ton or less in capacity and consists of several of the following: Bottles, tin cans, paper, cardboard, rags, grass clippings, hedge trimmings, prunings from trees and shrubs, shavings, bits and pieces of lumber, a few rocks or broken bricks, a few cubic feet (ten or less) of dirt, an appliance, a piece of furniture.

SPECIAL HANDLING FEE - VEHICLES

Any vehicle hauling any of the hereinafter described materials shall pay the fee hereinafter established therefor, or the fee established in Classes I, II or III hereof for such vehicle, whichever is greater:

Solid industrial waste \$.20 per cu. ft.

A load of which one-half or more consists of fish, poultry and/or animals, and/or parts, manure or byproducts thereof \$1.00 per cu. yd.

A load consisting of more than 1,000 gallons of dewatered sewage sludge, dry egg wastes or similar materials or a load containing more than 12 cu. yds. of straw, rubber tires, mattresses, bed springs, appliances, car seats, or similar hard-to-handle material. \$10.00

SPECIAL SURCHARGE HANDLING FEE - SOLID WASTE

In addition to all of the fees hereinbefore established, the following additional fees are established for dumping of the hereinafter solid wastes:

Pole, tree trunk, branch, pipe, piling, pillars, or the like 6 feet or more in length but less than 14 inches in diameter . . . \$1.50 per lin. ft. or part thereof

Pole, tree trunk, branch, pipe, piling, pillars or the like 14 inches or more in diameter at any point and any length \$1.50 per lin. ft. or part thereof

Any tree stump 3 feet or more in any lineal dimension \$3.00 per item plus \$.50 per lin. ft. in excess of 3 ft.

SPECIAL SURCHARGE HANDLING FEE - SOLID WASTE (continued)

Any single item 30 cubic feet or more in volume for which a surcharge is not otherwise established herein and for which the landfill is equipped to handle except that solid concrete block, boulders and the like shall be by special estimate in each instance \$.20 per cu. ft. in excess of 10 cu. ft.

Note: Advance arrangements must be made for depositing exceptionally large, long, heavy or bulky items.

DEFINITIONS

For the purposes of this fee schedule, the following terms shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them:

"Demolition materials" means materials or parts from new construction or wrecked or razed buildings or structures, and masonry and paving materials; demolition materials include but are not limited to broken concrete, asphalt, masonry, beams, poles, timbers, walls, roofs and plumbing lines and fixtures, or parts of any of them. (Dirt is Class III material except if a load has more than 25% of demolition material specified in this paragraph.)

"Demolition vehicle" means a vehicle hauling a load which, in the opinion of the landfill attendant, whose determination of the matter shall be final, consists of demolition materials to the extent of 25% or more.

"Director" means Public Works Director.

"Industrial wastes" means wastes from industrial and manufacturing operations which are collected and transported for disposal.

"Liquid wastes" means wastes that are loaded or unloaded through piping, tubing or hoses. Such wastes are not acceptable at City landfills.

"Refuse collection vehicle, mechanical packer" means a refuse vehicle with an integral power device for increasing density by compression or compaction.

"Refuse collection vehicle, nonpacker" means a refuse vehicle without a power-driven compaction device.

"Solid wastes" means wastes that are loaded or unloaded by hand, shovels, dumping from a truck, or means other than through piping, tubing or hoses.

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DEFINITIONS (continued)

"Hazardous waste" means explosives and toxic wastes that may be dangerous to man or impair quality of water. They include but are not limited to saline fluids from water treatment; toxic chemical toilet waste; brines from processing plants; spent cleaning fluids; petroleum fractions, chemicals, acids, alkalies, phenols, washing fluids; process ashes and chemical mixes that may leach toxics; pesticides and chemical fertilizers; and discarded chemical containers not cleansed per State and County regulations.

RULES, REGULATIONS AND SCHEDULE FOR COLLECTION OF FEES

1. A copy of the Fee Schedule established hereby shall be conspicuously posted near the attendant's station at each landfill. A copy of this regulation shall be maintained at each such attendant's station, and shall be available for public inspection during the hours in which said landfill is open to the public.
2. The Fee Schedule hereby established applies to all users of City landfills as follows:
 - a. Representatives of the State, County, a city, or any other governmental agency subject to exceptions authorized by Sections 66.0126 and 66.0127 of the San Diego Municipal Code.
 - b. General public when any portion of a load was generated outside the City of San Diego limits.
 - c. General public when the solid waste is classified demolition, special handling or special surcharge handling material, except that the Director is authorized to exempt payment of fees for solid waste generated within the City by nonprofit charitable organizations and as part of a civic group's nonprofit anti-litter clean-up campaign. Application for such exemption shall be made at least two weeks in advance of the campaign.
 - d. Upon application, the Director may exempt payment of fees for clean dirt and rip-rap; said materials to be subject to such reasonable disposal conditions as the Director may apply.
3. Demolition material shall not be deposited at Chollas landfill.
4. Nothing in the above Fee Schedule shall be interpreted to supersede the provisions of Section 66.0124 of the San Diego Municipal Code in regulating the operations of sanitary fills.

RULES, REGULATIONS AND SCHEDULE FOR COLLECTION OF FEES (continued)

5. Prior to the dumping of any garbage, rubbish, or other refuse at City landfills, payment therefor according to the Fee Schedule established herein shall be made either in cash or by use of prepurchased tickets or by deferred payment system as prescribed by the City. A fee collection program which will include record-keeping systems, and cash payment and/or prepurchase ticket systems, and/or deferred payment system, shall be prescribed, and modifications thereto considered from time to time by the City Auditor and Comptroller in consultation with the Director. The Director shall be responsible for the implementation and maintenance of said fee collection program and prior to permitting any refuse to be deposited at City landfills shall require reasonable proof of the origin of such refuse.
6. Hazardous wastes as defined herein shall not be deposited into any City landfill, but shall be referred to the County for disposal instructions.
