A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 210294, ADOPTED APRIL 2, 1974, RELATING TO THE JAPANESE BEETLE ERADICATION CONTROL PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 210294 was adopted by this Council on April 2, 1974; and

WHEREAS, said resolution urged the Department of Food and Agriculture of the State of California and the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego to take certain precautions in the use of insecticides in the Japanese Beetle Eradication Program, if it were determined that the use of insecticides were necessary; and

WHEREAS, subsequent events have made it apparent that a refinement of said precautions would enhance the protection afforded the health and safety of citizens and visitors to San Diego; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

That Sections 2 and 5 of Resolution No. 210294, adopted by the Council on April 2, 1974, are hereby amended to read as follows:

2. The dissemination of notices which describe the project, materials, health effects, requisite safety precautions, and responsible State and County officials to contact regarding grievances resulting from the

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implementation of the program. Said notices to be labeled "official public notice" and to include a warning that persons who suffer from heart, liver or respiratory disorders should consult their physicians to determine whether said persons should leave the spray area. Said notice to inform persons of the availability of free transportation for persons who are unable to provide their own transportation and who, for health reasons, should leave the area until the pesticide material has dried.

- 5. The provision of careful monitoring program in order to ensure that the frequency, volume and concentrations of pesticides are commensurate with actual beetle infestation and public health considerations. Said monitoring program to be described in a report to be sent to the Environmental Quality Department of The City of San Diego at least 60 days prior to resumption of insecticide application. Said monitoring to include the following:
- a. Pesticide residue studies on soil, vegetation and nontarget species using appropriate statistical sampling methods.
- b. Analysis to obtain data to establish trends in degradation products where feasible.
- c. Programs designed to determine trends in pesticide distribution and cumulative buildup.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Resolution No. 210294, adopted by this Council on April 2, 1974, is hereby amended by adding three sections to read as follows:

- 7. That the aforementioned governmental entities are urged not to resume the spraying of insecticides to eradicate Japanese Beetles after October, 1974, unless and until the State Department of Food and Agriculture takes the precautions described supra.
- 8. That the Environmental Quality Department shall cause to be convened the Pesticide Committee of the Quality of Life Board which shall hold at least one public meeting at which the State Department of Food and Agriculture monitoring program is evaluated. The results of said evaluation of monitoring program shall be sent to this Council.
- 9. That if the injunction (which the City Attorney was directed to seek by virtue of Resolution No. 211369) is unsuccessful, that the City Manager be and he is hereby directed to send out with the spraying crews to monitor infractions, appropriate City staff which has been trained relative to spraying techniques, notification of citizens, and medical forms.
