WHEREAS, Senator Roberti has introduced Senate Bill 143 which provides for an increase in the partial exemption of business inventories from local property tax; and

WHEREAS, The City of San Diego Department of Financial Management has analyzed the financial consequences to the City if Senate Bill 143 becomes law and has concluded that over a six-year period the provisions of said bill will cause a loss in City revenues of approximately \$4,000,000; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of The City of San Diego, California, hereby finds that the provisions of proposed Senate Bill 143 are contrary to the best interests and financial well-being of the citizens of San Diego, and hereby recommends that the bill be defeated unless provisions are made for a dollar-for-dollar reimbursement to The City of San Diego for all revenues that the City will lose under the current provisions of proposed Senate Bill 143.
