SUBJECT: CPO Transportation Improvement Program for Highways, 1975-1980

(R-75-1613, Docket of 1/30/75)

REFERENCE: CPO Board of Director's Agenda Report R-3-C dated January 20, 1975

The Federal Highway Administration and State AB 69 Guidelines require the preparation of a 5-year prioritized program for all federally funded and regionally significant highway projects. The material contained in the CPO report is directed to a prioritizing of those projects within the State Highway System.

The Department of Transportation, in coordination with the Planning Department, has reviewed the referenced CPO Report and the accompanying State Highway development program. It has been determined that the Short Range list of projects contained in the document for the years 1975-1980 are in agreement with CalTrans' most recent construction schedule. All projects within the San Diego City limits shown in this report are covered by previously Council approved freeway agreements between CalTrans and the City of San Diego. The recent action of the CPO Board of Directors to include Route 125 north of Route 52 in the 1995 network, as requested by the City Council, will require that the expenditures identified with the 1985-1995 time frame be increased to accommodate this additional construction. A figure of \$31 million is identified in the report as the estimated increase. Since the program beyond 1980 is based upon an assumed higher level of funding than is provided by existing sources, this adjustment to the program can be made without difficulty. The improvement program shown in the CPO Report was reviewed by the City-County Thoroughfare Advisory Committee on January 8, 1975.

It is recommended the proposed CPO Transportation Improvement Program for Highways outlined in the Executive Director's Report dated January 20, 1975 be supported subject to the adjustment necessary to include Route 125 north of Route 52 in the total 1995 expenditure summary.

Federal Highway Administration and State AB-69 Guidelines require the preparation of a 5-year prioritized program for all federally funded and regionally significant highway projects. Attachment 1 to this memorandum is the preliminary recommended 5-year program for State highway projects, FY75-76 through FY79-80. The map included in this attachment identifies those projects involving major highway construction. The project priorities are indicated on this map.

The 5-year State highway program is consistent with the prior approved 1985 and 1995 freeway and expressway plan and is based on the CALTRANS 1975 preliminary planning program. The total cost of the program, expressed in January 1974 dollars, is approximately \$255 million. Based on the highway cost escalation assumptions utilized in preparing the plan, the total cost in future dollars is \$388 million. Therefore it is my

#### RECOMMENDATION

that the Board of Directors approve Attachment 1, the Transportation Improvement Program for State highways, FY1975-76 through FY1979-80.

When approved, it will become part of the proposed Regional Transportation Plan with the understanding that through the Public Communications Program, these policy decisions, as they are made, will receive additional citizen and local agency review before the Board is asked to adopt the complete Regional Plan and its several elements in March, 1975.

#### Discussion

For this next five-year period, CALTRANS has estimated highway construction revenues of \$313 million in future dollars. Estimated costs exceed revenues anticipated by \$75 million or 25%. Thus, the recommended program is based on an assumed increase in funding of \$75 million or 25% over the 1975 to 1980 time period. The State 505 Commission was organized to recommend a statewide strategy to meet highway funding needs. One of the solutions currently being considered is to raise gasoline taxes. Staff is preparing a funding proposal to solve this problem as part of our AB-69 transmittal to be submitted for your consideration.

In January 1974 constant dollars, the cost of the 1985 Freeway and Expressway Staging Plan is \$497 million. Thus, an expenditure of \$255 million or about half of the 1985 system cost in the first half of the ten-year period provides reasonable progress towards the scheduled completion of the plan. An estimated twenty year construction expenditure forecast is shown below.

State Highway Construction Expenditure Forecast (January 1974 Dollars)

1975 - 1980	\$255 million
1980 - 1985	242 million
1985 - 1995	190 million


\*The addition of Rte. 125 north of Rte. 52 would increase this cost by approximately \$31 million.

To complete the Transportation Improvement Program a 5-year prioritized listing of federally funded and regionally arterial projects is required. The staff is currently preparing such a listing with input from the City-County Thoroughfare Advisory Committee for presentation at a later date. It will be based on the prioritized FAU project listing as well as input from the various jurisdictions.
