AVAILABILITY OF SCHOOLS

BACKGROUND

The San Diego City Council has long been concerned with the impact of new housing on schools and the availability of quality education for children generated by new housing. In the past, information from the affected school districts has been general and has left unanswered questions regarding the effect of the new housing on the affected school districts. It is the desire of the Council that this information be more specific and complete.

PURPOSE

To obtain complete and adequate information, in order that the Council will be knowledgeable about the impact on schools by zoning changes and new housing developments, questions will be asked of each affected school district.

POLICY

The City Council recognizes that it is the responsibility of the various school districts within the City of San Diego to determine the availability of schools based upon, and consistent with, standards of school availability established by the respective districts; however, it shall be the policy of the City Council that the availability of schools shall be considered as an important factor in determining the effect on the public health, safety and general welfare when deciding rezoning or the approval of developments which will generate more school age children, in the area in question.

IMPLEMENTING PROCEDURE

Information to be sought from the appropriate school board(s) will include:

- Is the development in question one which will have minimal student generating impact on the schools (such as an "adults only" development)? If so the following information is not required.
- II. The name and location of existing schools which serve the area in question.
 - a. School capacity.
 - b. Present enrollment.
 - c. The number of portable classrooms, the number of permanent classrooms, and the proportion of portable classrooms to total classrooms.
 - d. The existence of extended day or double sessions presently.
 - e. The impact of the additional students on existing schools; i.e. will they require portable classrooms, extended day sessions, double sessions or busing according to California State Education Code Distance Guidelines.
 - f. The distance of each designated school via streets from the geographic center of the new development.
- III. The location of any proposed schools which would serve the area.
 - a. Whether funding is available for the proposed school(s); when construction is to be completed?
 - b. The capacity of the proposed schools and the anticipated enrollment.
- IV. Any agreements entered into by the developer and the affected school district.
- V. Will the additional students require new schools which have not heretofore been planned?
- VI. The affected school district will be asked for a statement of availability.
