A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE MUNICIPAL PRIMARY ELECTION, THE SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION, AND THE SAN DIEGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT BOND ELECTION HELD IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, IN THE SAN DIEGO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, AND IN THE SAN DIEGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT, ON SEPTEMBER 16, 1975.

WHEREAS, a municipal primary election was held in the City of San Diego, the San Diego Unified School District, and the San Diego Community College District, on Tuesday, September 16, 1975, pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 11648 (New Series) for the purpose of nominating candidates; and


WHEREAS, a special municipal election was held in the City of San Diego on the same date, pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 11653 (New Series) adopted July 17, 1975, which special election was consolidated with the municipal primary election for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City of San Diego a proposition to amend the City Charter as follows:

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 213819, adopted July 17, 1975, the San Diego City Council consented to the consolidation of a part of San Diego Community College District bond election with the City of San Diego municipal primary election to be held on September 16, 1975, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City of San Diego a proposition to issue and sell bonds for the following purposes:

(a) The purchasing of school lots. (b) The building or purchasing of school buildings. (c) The making of alterations or additions to the school building or buildings other than such as may be necessary for current maintenance, operation, or repairs. (d) The repairing, restoring, or rebuilding of any school building damaged, injured, or destroyed by fire or other public calamity. (e) The supplying of school buildings and grounds with furniture, equipment or necessary apparatus of a permanent nature. (f) The permanent improvement of the school grounds. (g) The carrying out of the projects or purposes authorized in Section 15811 of the Education Code, to wit: providing sewers and drains adequate to treat and/or dispose of sewage and drainage on or away from any school property. (h) The purchase of school buses, the useful life of which is as least twenty (20) years. (i) The demolition or razing of any school building with the intent to replace it with another school building whether in the same location or in any other location. Said bonds proposed to be issued and sold shall bear interest at a rate of not exceeding 8% per annum, payable annually for the first year the bonds have to run, and semi-annually thereafter.
