RESOLUTION DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION AND THE SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, IN THE SAN DIEGO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, AND IN THE SAN DIEGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT ON NOVEMBER 4, 1975.

WHEREAS, a general municipal election was held in the City of San Diego, the San Diego Unified School District, and in the San Diego Community College District on Tuesday, November 4, 1975, pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 11684 (New Series) for the purpose of electing candidates; and

WHEREAS, this Council by Ordinance No. 11662 (New Series) adopted August 21, 1975, called a special municipal election to be held in the City on the same date for the purpose of proposing and submitting to the qualified voters of the City nine propositions to amend the Charter of The City of San Diego as follows:

PROPOSITION B

PROPOSITION B. CITY OF SAN DIEGO CHARTER AMENDMENT. AMENDS SECTIONS 10, 12, AND 40 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO.

Provides that commencing in 1984, elections to the office of Mayor and City Attorney shall be held every four years at the same time as the California State primary and general elections. Extends the term of the office of Mayor elected in 1979 to five (5) years and the term of the office of City Attorney elected in 1977 to seven (7) years.

PROPOSITION C

PROPOSITION C. CITY OF SAN DIEGO CHARTER AMENDMENT. AMENDS SECTIONS 16 AND 75 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO.

Provides that the ordinances making the annual tax levy may be passed by the City Council on the day of their introduction, and may be adopted on the last day in August instead of the last Tuesday in August.

PROPOSITION D

PROPOSITION D. CITY OF SAN DIEGO CHARTER AMENDMENT. AMENDS SECTION 35 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO.

Deletes the dollar limits for the purchasing of supplies, materials, equipment and insurance without advertising for sealed proposals and substitutes limits to be established by ordinance of the City Council. Specifically authorizes the City Council to allow the City Purchasing Agent to participate in joint and cooperative purchasing with other public agencies.

PROPOSITION E

PROPOSITION E. CITY OF SAN DIEGO CHARTER AMENDMENT. AMENDS SECTION 55 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO.

Reduces the amount presently being set aside in the Mt. Hope Cemetery Perpetuity Fund from fifty percent (50%) of the revenue from sales to twenty percent (20%) of the revenue from sales, and requires the City Council to set aside sufficient funds to defray maintenance costs if the income from the Perpetuity Fund proves insufficient.

PROPOSITION F

PROPOSITION F. CITY OF SAN DIEGO CHARTER AMENDMENT. AMENDS SECTION 94 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO.

Deletes the requirement that a surety bond insuring faithful performance of City contracts be furnished on contracts less than Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000).

PROPOSITION G

PROPOSITION G. CITY OF SAN DIEGO CHARTER AMENDMENT. AMENDS SECTION 98 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO.

Deletes the Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) limit on alterations in contracts without specific Council authorization and substitutes a limit to be established by ordinance of the City Council.

PROPOSITION H

PROPOSITION H. CITY OF SAN DIEGO CHARTER AMENDMENT. AMENDS SECTION 129 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO.

Grants to the Civil Service Commission authority to establish procedures for hearing appeals of classified employees who have been suspended from office for cause and to establish rules and regulations governing layoffs for lack of funds or work.

PROPOSITION J

PROPOSITION J. CITY OF SAN DIEGO CHARTER AMENDMENT. ADDS SECTION 77C TO THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO.

Grants the City Council power to levy annually a special tax not to exceed five cents (\$0.05) on each One Hundred Dollars (\$100) of assessed valuation of real and personal property to be used solely and exclusively for public transportation for the elderly and handicapped.

PROPOSITION K

PROPOSITION K. CITY OF SAN DIEGO CHARTER AMENDMENT. ADDS SECTION 77D TO THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO.

Grants the City Council power to levy annually a special tax not to exceed fifteen cents (\$0.15) on each One Hundred Dollars (\$100) of assessed valuation of real and personal property for the fiscal year commencing 1976, and a special tax not to exceed ten cents (\$0.10) on each One Hundred Dollars (\$100) of assessed valuation of real and personal property for each year thereafter commencing July 1, 1977, to be used solely and exclusively for operation and funding of a paramedic services program within the City of San Diego.

WHEREAS, a copy of the certificate of the Registrar of Voters of the County of San Diego canvassing the returns of the general municipal election and the special municipal election, including absentee votes cast, as certified to the City Clerk, has been duly received; and

WHEREAS, a canvass of these elections has been completed and the City Clerk has certified the results to the City Council; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that the Council finds and determines, pursuant to the provisions of Section 27.2206 of the San Diego Municipal Code, as follows:

- 1. The total number of votes cast in the City, including absentee votes, was $\frac{135,270}{}$.
- 2. The total number of votes cast in the San Diego Unified School District, including absentee votes, was 126,487 .
- 3. The total number of votes cast in the San Diego Community College District, including absentee votes, was $\frac{126,487}{}$.
- 4. The total number of votes, including absentee votes, received by each municipal candidate and each candidate for the Board of Education of the San Diego Unified School District and each candidate for the Governing Board of Trustees of the San Diego Community College District is as follows:
