AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER III, ARTICLE 2 OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTION 32.01 RELATING TO ALLOCATION OF SALES TAX REVENUES.

WHEREAS, it is City practice to keep heavy fire suppression apparatus in active service for eighteen years and in reserve for another seven years; and

WHEREAS, the assignment of an eighteen-year usable life is fairly common among most large cities; and

WHEREAS, due to increasing costs of these major pieces of equipment and the requirement that purchases be funded from the operating budget, the City's replacement program has slipped considerably; and

WHEREAS, in fiscal year 1976 there are twenty-nine pieces of equipment eligible for replacement at an estimated cost of \$2,520,000; and

WHEREAS, due to financial constraints, it was possible to budget for only two replacement pumpers in fiscal 1976; and

WHEREAS, absent replacement of equipment at the end of scheduled useful life, additional maintenance costs and resulting out-of-commission times are considerable; and

WHEREAS, if additional funds are made available, the replacement requirement of the twenty-nine pieces will be programmed over the next three fiscal years; and

WHEREAS, it is proposed to amend the sales tax revenue allocation to permit a maximum of one million dollars

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(\$1,000,000) of these funds to be used for the above purpose;
NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego,
as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter III, Article 2 of the San Diego
Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended by amending
Section 32.01 to read as follows:

SEC. 32.01 ALLOCATION OF REVENUE FOR CAPITAL
OUTLAY EXPENDITURES

One-fourth of the total revenue collected from the
tax imposed by this article shall be paid into the
Capital Outlay Fund and shall be used for capital outlay
expenditures; provided, however, that a sufficient por-
tion of said revenue shall be used for annual debt service
of bonds issued for the purchase of Community Concourse
properties; and provided further that a maximum of one
million dollars annually of said revenue may be used the
next three fiscal years for replacement of fire suppression
heavy motive equipment which has been assigned a service
life expectancy of eighteen years.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in
force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage.

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

One-fourth of the total revenue collected from the tax imposed by this article shall be paid into the Capital Outlay Fund and shall be used for capital outlay expenditures; provided, however, that a sufficient portion of said revenue shall be used for annual debt service of bonds issued for the purchase of Community Concourse properties; and provided further that a maximum of one million dollars annually of said revenue may be used the next three fiscal years for replacement of fire suppression heavy motive equipment which has been assigned a service life expectancy of eighteen years.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage.
