WHEREAS, MR. and MRS. JOHN E. HUGHES and EDWIN P.
BALMER appealed the decision of the Planning Commission
in granting the appeal of LEON E. CAMPBELL from the
decision of the Subdivision Review Board denying the
Tentative Map of La Jolla Hillside, a 4-lot Subdivision
of Parcel 2, Parcel Map 2230, which is a consolidation
and division of Lots A, C, and D, Resub. of La Jolla
Hills No. 2, and also Lot 62 and portions of Lots 61
and 63, La Jolla Hills, located on the south side of
Hillside Drive near the easterly terminus of Puente
Drive, in the R-1-5 (HR OVERLAY) Zone, within the La Jolla
Community Plan; and

WHEREAS, on October 7, 1975, the Planning Commission voted 4 to 3 to grant the appeal and approve the tentative map and overrule the decision of the Subdivision Review Board; and

WHEREAS, on October 20, 1975 and October 21, 1975, pursuant to the provisions of Section 101.0506 of the San Diego Municipal Code, MR. and MRS. JOHN E. HUGHES and EDWIN P. BALMER appealed the decision of the Planning Commission; and

WHEREAS, said appeals were set for public hearing on November 13, 1975, continued to November 20, 1975, January 8, and January 22, 1976, testimony having been heard, evidence having been submitted and the City

WHEREAS, the City Council in considering said appeals is empowered by the provisions of Municipal Code,

Section 102.0205 to affirm, reverse or modify in whole or in part any determination of the Planning Commission, subject to the limitations as are placed upon the Planning Commission by the Municipal Code; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

That the City Council adopts findings of the Planning Commission on tentative subdivision map, LA JOLLA HILLSIDE, as follows:

- This tentative subdivision map to expire
 months from the date of Council approval of this resolution.
- 2. The "General Conditions of Approval for Tentative Maps" filed in the Office of the City Clerk under Document No. 744827, on September 10, 1973, shall be made a condition of map approval.
- 3. The pavement schedule as specified on Drawings G-58 and G-59, in the City of San Diego Standard Drawings, Document No. 735691, shall be used to determine pavement thicknesses on all streets bounding or within the subdivision.
- 4. All grading and slope planting shall conform to the provisions of San Diego Municipal Code, Section 62.0101 et seq. No slope shall be greater than 60 feet in vertical height without approval of the Planning Commission. MICROFILMET

- 5. Undergrounding of public utility systems and service facilities is required according to San Diego Municipal Code, Section 102.2221, Subsection 7.
- 6. To comply with San Diego Municipal Code, Section 102.0800 et seq. (Park Fees), the subdivider shall pay a fee of \$100.00 per lot prior to the filing of the final subdivision map. This property is also subject to a Building Permit Park Fee in accordance with San Diego Municipal Code, Section 99.0100 et seq.
- 7. This property is subject to a water capacity charge as specified in San Diego Municipal Code, Section 67.72.
- 8. This property is subject to a sewer capacity charge as specified in San Diego Municipal Code, Sections 64.32.2 and 64.35.
- 9. Dedicate and improve Hillside Drive with additional pavement, curb, and sidewalk on an alignment and grade satisfactory to the City Engineer. Construct a pavement transition section at the east subdivision boundary for Hillside Drive, satisfactory to the City Engineer.
- 10. The subdivider shall underground existing power and telephone lines located along Hillside Drive in accordance with San Diego Municipal Code, Section 102.0221, Subsection 7, unless the waiver of undergrounding is obtained from the City Council. Prior to the submittal of the final subdivision

MICROFILMED MAY 2 2 1978 map for City Council approval, the subdivider shall provide evidence that arrangements satisfactory to the City Engineer have been made with the appropriate company to underground their existing facilities.

- A geological reconnaissance and soils report shall be provided to demonstrate the stability of the site, considering both geological factors and soil properties.
- Install a fire hydrant on Hillside Drive at a location satisfactory to the City Engineer.
- Fire protection and water service to General Plan standards cannot be provided above elevation 353 M.S.L.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that by a vote of 9 to 0, the appeals of MR. and MRS. JOHN E. HUGHES and EDWIN P. BALMER, are denied; and the decision of the Planning Commission to grant the appeal and overrule the decision of the Subdivision Review Board is sustained, and said tentative map is hereby granted.
