WHEREAS, the people of the State of California enacted the California Coastal Zone Conservation Act of 1972, declaring that the California coastal zone is a distinct and valuable resource, and that it is the policy of the state to preserve, protect and, where possible, restore the resources of the coastal zone; and have declared that a comprehensive, coordinated and enforceable plan shall be prepared for the natural resources of the coastal zone; and

WHEREAS, the California Coastal Plan has been prepared and submitted to the State of California Legislature; and Senate Bill 1579, based on that plan, has been introduced in the State Legislature to enact the California Coastal Conservation Act of 1976; and

WHEREAS, the Council of The City of San Diego has supported continuing efforts to provide protection and enhancement of statewide coastal resources and, in recognition of the importance of natural and man-made resources of the coastal areas, has placed continuing high priority in its planning efforts in this City's coastal area; and

WHEREAS, the Council of The City of San Diego has prepared, adopted and continues efforts to implement comprehensive plans for coastal communities within its City limits, including the Torrey Pines Community Plan; and

WHEREAS, the goals, objectives and policies contained in the Torrey Pines Community Plan have been analyzed with respect to the 162 policies contained in the California Coastal Plan; and

WHEREAS, at the March 4, 1976 meeting of the Planning Commission the Planning Department and Planning Commission of The City of San Diego concurred that the policies of the Torrey Pines Community Plan are consistent with the policies of the California Coastal Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Council of The City of San Diego has reviewed the Torrey Pines Community Plan, the policies of the California Coastal Plan and the study and recommendations of its Planning Department and Planning Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Council of The City of San Diego, in recognizing the extensive local effort that will be required in a relatively short period of time to comply with the California Coastal Plan legislation, desires to proceed without delay in this effort; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego that said Council finds the Torrey Pines Community Plan consistent with the policies of the California Coastal Plan.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of The City of San Diego submits this analysis and recommendation to the San Diego Coast Regional Commission for the purpose of determining the findings of that body.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of The City of San Diego be advised of findings and recommendations made by the San Diego Coast Regional Commission in this matter in order for The City of San Diego to consider such findings and recommendations in processing additional community plans affected by the requirements of the California Coastal Plan.
