WHEREAS, residential burglary has dramatically increased within the City of San Diego; and

WHEREAS, a recent survey conducted by the City for the Community Relations Board revealed that the number one law enforcement concern of citizens was burglaries within their neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, burglary prevention is a significant means by which to deter this crime; and

WHEREAS, many homes and apartments can be made more secure with the addition of certain antiburglary devices; and

WHEREAS, the City Council should explore all areas in which crime may be reduced; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego that it hereby establishes, pursuant to Charter Section 43(b), a Citizen Committee to determine ways in which homes and apartments could be constructed or remodeled to discourage and prevent residential burglary. The membership of the Task Force shall consist of the individuals designated in Attachment "A" of this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Citizen Committee shall report to the Council no later than January 1, 1977 with its findings and recommendations on:

- 1. Ways in which appropriate City ordinances may be amended or added to require the inclusion of antiburglary standards in new home and apartment construction.
- 2. The estimated cost to contractors, homebuyers and renters as a result of the increased requirements recommended by the Citizen Committee.
- 3. The degree by which burglary can be prevented by virtue of antiburglary construction requirements.
- 4. The effect that the passage of such an ordinance would have upon homeowner insurance rates.
- 5. Incentives to encourage existing housing to conform to antiburglary requirements.
- 6. Any other recommendations which the Task Force deems appropriate.
