SUBJECT: Federal Aid Urban (FAU) Program

Appearing on today's docket is a resolution authorizing the City Manager to submit to the Federal Aid Urban Advisory Committee applications for funding twenty-seven (27) street improvement and/or traffic control projects within the City of San Diego under the Federal Aid Urban Program for fiscal years 1977 and 1978.

RECOMMENDATION

That the resolution be adopted.

BACKGROUND

The Federal Aid Highway Act of 1976 was recently signed into law by the President. For City governments the most significant feature of the Act is the continuation of the Federal Aid Urban (FAU) Program with an appropriation of \$800 million in each of the fiscal years 1976-77 and 1977-78. An additional \$200 million is also appropriated to cover the transitional quarter from June 30, 1976 to September 30, 1976 to accommodate the change in the federal fiscal year.

Under an established formula whereby FAU funds are allocated on the basis of urbanized area population, the San Diego region can expect to receive approximately \$14.2 million over the 2½ year life of the program for improvements on designated State highways, City streets, County roads, or for mass transit facilities.

This report is offered for the purpose of obtaining Council endorsement of a list of recommended candidate projects to be submitted to the local Federal Aid Urban Advisory Committee for evaluation and ranking in relation to candidate projects submitted by the other cities, the County, the Metropolitan Transit Development Board, the North County Transit Development Board and CALTRANS. The recommended City projects, which are supportive of the Council approved Capital Improvement Program, are as follows:
