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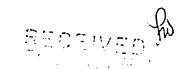

T3JECT: Executive Session Procedure

> The recent amendment to the Brown Act requires that action regarding personnel matters taken in executive session should be reported by Council in an open Council meeting and the vote taken in executive session reported publicly. Legislation is currently pending in Sacramento to extend this requirement to all action taken in executive session.

> Under "Special Order of Business" on your docket of March 9 as Item 106, there appeared a resolution authorizing the City Attorney to settle a condemnation case. You asked for a clarification of the procedure in view of the matter having been handled previously in executive session and not being a personnel matter. Due to the fact that the "litigation exception" is judicially mandated, rather than legislative, and because of the pending legislation, we determined it is appropriate to use the same procedure in reporting executive session action on pending litigation as that used in personnel matters.

> Therefore, in all cases where it is possible to obtain an auditor's certificate in advance of the council executive session, my office will provide the Mayor with a resolution and the appropriate form for recording the vote. The matter will then be put on Council docket as a general notice item and the vote taken in executive session will be announced in that manner. The vote taken in executive session will be the official vote and no vote need be taken in the public meeting.

In some cases an auditor's certificate cannot be obtained prior to the executive session because a finally agreed upon settlement has not been reached. In such a situation, your approval is not asked with respect to a specific settlement amount. Rather, we ask the Council for authority to settle the case at some amount no greater than the amount you specify. When the settlement subsequently has been agreed to, it will be necessary to place a resolution under "Special Order of Business" and take a vote on the resolution in open meeting. This open meeting vote then becomes the official vote on the resolution and the vote taken in executive session has no further meaning. This was the procedure utilized with respect to Item 106 on the March 9 docket.
