BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

The following findings are made in respect to the significant environmental impacts identified in Environmental Impact Report No. 76-11-14:

- 1. Noise. The adverse impacts of ambient noise have been reduced to the level of insignificance with respect to the proposed restaurant by the incorporation into the design of the facility of block walls and insulative measures. There is no economically or technologically feasible method of reducing the impact of noise on the outdoor activity of the skateboard park. While the ambient noise level may interfere with conversation, the nature of the activity, skateboarding, does not ordinarily involve extensive conversation.
- 2. Air Quality. While carbon monoxide pollution exceeding federal and state standards may occur during "worst case" situations, such conditions should not exceed 7 percent of the time during the least favorable months of December through February. This impact would rarely apply to the skateboard area. No modifications are technologically or economically feasible to mitigate this impact.
