## ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT SECTION 15088 FINDINGS FOR VILLA LA JOLLA UNITS TWO AND FIVE (THE DEDICATION OF VILLA NORTE)

The following findings are recommended relative to the conclusions of the final Environmental Impact Report for Villa La Jolla Units Two and Five (EQD #75-10-21) as that report relates to the street dedication of Villa Norte in Parcel 4, Parcel Map Number 5323. These findings have been prepared pursuant to Title 14, Division 6, Chapter 3, Section 15088 of the California Administrative Code.

The final Environmental Impact Report made essentially three determinations. These, with appropriate findings, are:

1. "The proposed project...would result in extensive disruption of natural landform..."

Finding: Grading has previously taken place under the approved Land Development Permit for Villa La Jolla Units Two and Five. Approval of the dedication of Villa Norte will neither effect this previous determination nor will it in itself have a significant environmental effect. No further finding need be made, therefore, pursuant to Section 15088 of the California Administrative Code.

2. "The proposed project...would create short-term visual disruption."

Finding: Approval of the dedication of Villa Norte
will allow orderly development of a portion of Villa La Jolla
to proceed. This will ultimately have an effectively "mitigative"

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influence in that landscaping and build out of the presently barren, graded pads will constitute a significant improvement in the visual quality of the property.

3. "The proposed project...would facilitate rapid growth...
would place heavy demands on community...facilities,...
and would make substantial contributions to ambient
levels of traffic, noise and air pollutants..."

Finding: Although Villa Norte will itself be an incremental part of Villa La Jolla, it will not, by itself, have a significant effect. There are no mitigation measures, per se, which can be feasibly applied to this one increment. It may be feasible, however, to apply mitigating measures at other points in the developmental process of Villa La Jolla Units Two and Five, at times when additional discretionary actions need be approved. Because dedication of this street will in and of itself have no significant effect, no additional finding need be made pursuant to Section 15088 of the California Administrative Code.
