AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA, ORDERING, CALLING, PROVIDING FOR AND GIVING NOTICE OF A SPECIAL MUNICIPAL BOND ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO ON JUNE 6, 1978 FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE CITY ONE PROPOSITION TO INCUR GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDED INDEBTEDNESS BY THE CITY FOR CERTAIN MUNICIPAL IMPROVEMENTS AND CONSOLIDATING THE SPECIAL MUNICIPAL BOND ELECTION WITH THE STATEWIDE PRIMARY ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE SAME DATE.

WHEREAS, this Council has commenced proceedings and intends to call a special municipal bond election in the City to be held on June 6, 1978, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City a general obligation proposition as set forth in this ordinance; and

WHEREAS, at a meeting held on March 14, 1978, being a meeting held prior to the meeting at which this ordinance is adopted, the City Council of The City of San Diego, by a vote of at least two-thirds of all its members, adopted Resolution No. 220475 determining that the public interest and necessity demand the acquisition of certain municipal improvements, to wit: to implement a modernization and decentralization program to better service the law enforcement and public safety needs of the citizens of the City of San Diego by the acquisition, construction or completion of certain improvements, buildings and related facilities, for use of the San Diego Police Department including, but not limited

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to, an administrative and technical center, police substations and maintenance and storage facilities; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that this special municipal bond election be consolidated with the statewide primary election to be held on the same date and that within the City, the election precincts, polling places, voting booths and election officials for the two elections be the same, and that the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego be authorized to canvass the returns of the special municipal bond election, and that this special municipal bond election and the statewide primary election be held in all respects as if there were only one election; and

WHEREAS, concurrently with the adoption of this ordinance, the Council of The City of San Diego adopted Resolution No.

220522 requesting the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego to order the consolidation of the special municipal bond election to be held on June 6, 1978, with the statewide primary election to be held on the same date; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego is expected to grant the request and order the consolidation of the two elections; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, California, as follows:

Section 1. A special municipal bond election is hereby called and ordered to be held in the City of San Diego, California, on June 6, 1978, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City one proposition to incur

general obligation bonded indebtedness and to issue bonds of the City in the principal amount and for the objects and purposes stated in Resolution No. 220475, adopted by the Council on MAR 14, 1978, and as stated in the ballot proposition hereinafter set forth.

Section 2. The proposition to be voted upon at this special municipal bond election shall be substantially as follows:

PROPOSITION . CITY OF SAN DIEGO POLICE FACILITIES
BOND PROPOSAL.

For the purposes of implementing a modernization and decentralization program to better service the law enforcement and public safety needs of the citizens of San Diego, shall the City of San Diego incur a bonded indebtedness in the principal amount of twenty-two million two hundred thousand dollars (\$22,200,000.00) to permit the acquisition, construction or completion of public improvements and facilities for the use by the Police Department?

Section 3. The estimated cost of the municipal improvements described in the foregoing ballot proposition is the principal amount of the indebtedness proposed to be incurred. The estimated cost of such municipal improvements includes the following:

(a) Legal or other fees incidental to or connected with the authorization, issuance and sale-of the bonds; and

(b) The cost of printing the bonds and other costs and expenses incidental to or connected with the authorization, issuance and sale of the bonds.

Section 4. The maximum rate of interest to be paid on each indebtedness shall not exceed the maximum rate permitted by law (eight percent (8%) per annum), the actual rate or rates of interest on the bonds to be determined at or prior to the time of the sale or sales of the bonds. Interest shall be payable semiannually, except that interest for the first year after the date of the bonds may be payable at the end of such year.

Section 5. This proposition shall be presented and printed on the ballot and submitted to the voter in the manner and form set out in Section 7 of this ordinance.

Section 6. The polls for this special municipal bond election shall be open at 7 a.m. (local time) on June 6, 1978, and shall remain open continuously until 8 p.m. (local time) of the same day at which time the polls shall be closed except as provided in Section 14301 of the Elections Code of the State of California.

Section 7. Since this election is being consolidated with the statewide general primary election, and since the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego is hereby authorized to canvass returns of this election, and since only one form of ballot is authorized, the method of voting upon these measures shall be as provided in the Elections Code of the State of California, the form of the proposition as it is to appear on the ballot is as follows:

PROPOSITION ____ . CITY OF SAN DIEGO
POLICE FACILITIES BOND PROPOSAL.

For the purposes of implementing a modernization and decentralization program to better service the law enforcement and public safety needs of the citizens of San Diego, shall the City of San Diego incur a bonded indebtedness in the principal amount of twenty-two million two hundred thousand dollars (\$22,200,000.00) to permit the acquisition, construction or completion of public improvements and facilities for the use by the Police Department?

Section 8. An appropriate mark placed in the voting square after the word "YES" shall be counted in favor of the adoption of the proposition. An appropriate mark placed in the voting square after the word "NO" shall be counted against the proposition.

Section 9. If the proposition to incur bonded indebtedness submitted by this ordinance receives the requisite number of votes, to wit: two-thirds of the votes of the qualified voters of the City voting on such proposition, general obligation bonds of the City in an amount not to exceed the principal amount stated in the proposition as set forth in this ordinance may be issued and sold for the object and purpose as contained in such proposition.

Section 10. The proposition submitted by this ordinance shall be designated on the ballot by a letter printed on the left margin of the square containing the description of the measure as provided in Section 10219 of the Elections Code of

the State of California.

Section 11. The special municipal bond election called for June 6, 1978, in the City of San Diego is hereby ordered consolidated with the statewide primary election to be held on the same date. Within the City of San Diego, the precincts, polling places and officers of the election for the special municipal bond election shall be the same as those provided for in the statewide primary election, all as set forth in the List of Election Officers and Polling Places for the Primary Election which will be on file in the Office of the Registrar of Voters, San Diego County, as of April 1, 1978 and which is proposed to be published throughout the City between May 17 and May 25, 1978 in the following newspapers: La Jolla Light; Voice Viewpoint; The San Diego Union; The Sentinel; San Dieguito Citizen; Rancho Bernardo News; Life-News, College Edition; Life-News, Lake Murray/ Allied Gardens Edition; Chula Vista Star News; and Imperial Beach Star News.

Section 12. The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego is hereby authorized to canvass the returns of the special municipal bond election and these elections shall be held in all respects as if there were only one election and, within the City, only one form of ballot shall be used. The Board of Supervisors shall certify the results of the canvass of the returns of this special municipal bond election to the Council of The City of San Diego which shall then declare the results of the election.

Section 13. Except as otherwise provided in this ordinance, the special municipal bond election shall be conducted as provided by law for other municipal elections of the City.

Section 14. The City Clerk shall cause this ordinance to be published in those languages required by law once a week for two weeks in the official newspaper no later than fifty days before the date of the election. No other notice of the election need be given.

Section 15. This ordinance shall take effect on MAR 21, 1978, being the day of its introduction and passage, pursuant to Sections 16 and 17 of the Charter of The City of San Diego.
