AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER II, ARTICLE 7,
DIVISIONS 25, 26 AND 27 OF THE SAN DIEGO
MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTIONS 27.2514,
27.2611 AND 27.2716 TO PERMIT RANDOM
SAMPLING IN VERIFICATION OF INITIATIVE,
REFERENDUM AND RECALL PETITIONS.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego,
as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter II, Article 7, Division 25 of
the San Diego Municipal Code be and it is hereby amended by
amending Section 27.2514 to read as follows:

SEC. 27.2514 VERIFICATION OF PETITION; TIME, RANDOM
SAMPLING

The Clerk shall be allowed a period of thirty days
after the filing of an initiative petition to examine
and verify the signatures of the petitioners. He shall
indicate on each petition the date on which it was filed
and the name of the person by whom it was filed.

Signatures may be verified by use of the random
sampling method set forth in Section 3708 of the California
Elections Code. In the event that any elector of the
City of San Diego challenges the determination of the
sufficiency of the signatures on the petition by the
random sampling method, the City Clerk shall proceed to
verify the sufficiency of each signature on the petition
if the elector so challenging posts with the City Clerk

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such amount of money as is required to fully pay for the cost of such further verification. Any such challenge of the verification by the random sampling method shall be made no later than the close of business on the fourth day following announcement of the sufficiency.

Section 2. That Chapter II, Article 7, Division 26 of the San Diego Municipal Code be and it is hereby amended by amending Section 27.2611 to read as follows:

SEC. 27.2611 VERIFICATION OF PETITION; TIME; RANDOM SAMPLING

The Clerk shall be allowed a period of thirty days after the filing of the last-filed portion of a referendary petition to examine and verify the signatures of the petitioners. He shall indicate on each petition the date on which it was filed and the name of the person by whom it was filed.

Signatures may be verified by use of the random sampling method set forth in Section 3708 of the California Elections Code. In the event that any elector of the City of San Diego challenges the determination of the sufficiency of the signatures on the petition by the random sampling method, the City Clerk shall proceed to verify the sufficiency of each signature on the petition if the elector so challenging posts with the City Clerk such amount of money as is required to fully pay for the cost of such further verification. Any such

challenge of the verification by the random sampling method shall be made no later than the close of business on the fourth day following announcement of the sufficiency.

Section 3. That Chapter II, Article 7, Division 27 of the San Diego Municipal Code be and it is hereby amended by amending Section 27.2716 to read as follows:

SEC. 27.2716 VERIFICATION OF PETITION; TIME; RANDOM SAMPLING


The Clerk shall be allowed a period of thirty days after the filing of a recall petition to examine and verify the signatures of the petitioners. He shall indicate on each petition the date on which it was filed and the name of the person by whom it was filed.

Signatures may be verified by use of the random sampling method set forth in Section 3708 of the California Elections Code. In the event that any elector of the City of San Diego challenges the determination of the sufficiency of the signatures on the petition by the random sampling method, the City Clerk shall proceed to verify the sufficiency of each signature on the petition if the elector so challenging posts with the City Clerk such amount of money as is required to fully pay for the cost of such further verification. Any such challenge of the verification by the random sampling method shall be made no later than the close of business on the fourth day following announcement of the sufficiency.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:
Section 1. That Chapter II, Article 7, Division 26 of the San Diego Municipal Code be and it is hereby amended by amending Section 27.2614 to read as follows:

SEC. 27.2614 VERIFICATION OF PETITION; TIME, RANDOM SAMPLING

The Clerk shall be allowed a period of thirty days after the filing of an initiative petition to examine and verify the signatures of the petitioners. He shall indicate on each petition the date on which it was filed and the name of the person by whom it was filed.

Signatures may be verified by use of the random sampling method set forth in Section 3708 of the California Elections Code. In the event that any elector of the City of San Diego challenges the determination of the sufficiency of the signatures on the petition by the random sampling method, the City Clerk shall proceed to verify the sufficiency of each signature on the petition if the elector so challenging pays with the City Clerk such amount of money as is required to fully pay for the cost of such further verification. Any such challenge of the verification by the random sampling method shall be made no later than the close of business on the fourth day following announcement of the sufficiency.

Section 2. That Chapter II, Article 7, Division 28 of the San Diego Municipal Code be and it is hereby amended by amending Section 27.2611 to read as follows:

SEC. 27.2611 VERIFICATION OF PETITION; TIME, RANDOM SAMPLING

The Clerk shall be allowed a period of thirty days after the filing of the last filed portion of a referendum petition to examine and verify the signatures of the petitioners. He shall indicate on each petition the date on which it was filed and the name of the person by whom it was filed.

Signatures may be verified by use of the random sampling method set forth in Section 3708 of the California Elections Code. In the event that any elector of the City of San Diego challenges the determination of the sufficiency of the signatures on the petition by the random sampling method, the City Clerk shall proceed to verify the sufficiency of each signature on the petition if the elector so challenging pays with the City Clerk such amount of money as is required to fully pay for the cost of such further verification. Any such challenge of the verification by the random sampling method shall be made no later than the close of business on the fourth day following announcement of the sufficiency.
