WHEREAS, HARLIN P. KERMICLE, Owner, and REIS E. WIGLESWORTH, both hereafter referred to as "Permittee," filed an application to allow development of a single-family subdivision (approximately 45 acres), in the R-1-5 (portion in the Hillside Review Overlay) Zone, located on the west side of 65th Street between Sullivan Avenue and Medio Street, more particularly described as Lots J, K, M, N, and O, Encanto Subdivision; and

WHEREAS, on December 1, 1977, the Planning Commission of The City of San Diego made its finding of facts which are set forth in Resolution No. 1086, recommended approval of said hillside review permit, and filed the decision in the office of the City Clerk on December 8, 1977; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Section 101.0454 of the San Diego Municipal Code, the SOUTHEAST SAN DIEGO DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE, by Verna M. Quinn, vice-chairman, appealed the decision of the Planning Commission; and

WHEREAS, said appeal was set for public hearing on January 17, 1978; and

WHEREAS, the Council of The City of San Diego received for its consideration documentary, written and oral testimony and heard from all interested parties present at the public hearings; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:



All of the following facts exist with respect to Hillside Review Permit No. 101:

- 1. The development will result in minimum disturbance of the natural terrain commensurate with the proposed use of the lot or premises. The grading in areas within the Hillside Review Zone is dictated by the subdivision design for the remainder of the property.
- 2. The grading and excavating proposed in connection with the development will not result in soil erosion, silting of lower slopes, slide damage, flooding problems, or severe cutting or scarring. All cut and fill slopes will be 1 and 1/2 to 1 and planted to prevent erosion and silting problems. The Hillside Review portions of the site form a relatively small portion of the entire subdivision. Grading within the Hillside Review areas is consistent with grading for the remainder of the project.
- 3. The proposed development will serve to preserve and enhance the natural environment and the aesthetic qualities of the site. The proposed development will form an integral part of a new single-family, residential subdivision. Since the Hillside Review areas of the site form such a small portion of the total project, it is believed that their conformity with the remainder of the project will provide the best aesthetic qualities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the appeal of the SOUTHEAST
SAN DIEGO DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE, by Verna M. Quinn, vice-chairman,
is denied, and this Council does hereby grant to HARLIN P.
KERMICLE and REIS E. WIGLESWORTH, Hillside Review Permit No. 101,

## HILLSIDE REVIEW PERMIT NO. 101 CITY COUNCIL

This hillside review permit is granted by the City Council of The City of San Diego to HARLIN P. KERMICLE, Owner, and REIS E. WIGLESWORTH, both hereafter referred to as "Permittee," for the purposes and under the terms and on the conditions as set out herein, pursuant to the authority contained in Section 101.0454 of the San Diego Municipal Code.

- 1. Permission is hereby granted to Permittee to develop the subject property located on the west side of 65th Street between Sullivan Avenue and Medio Street, more particularly described as Lots J, K, M, N, and O, Encanto Subdivision, Map No. 749, on file in the office of the County Recorder, in the R-1-5 Zone.
  - 2. Slopes shall not exceed 1 1/2:1 in grade.
- 3. The Permittee shall comply with the General Conditions for Hillside Review Permits attached hereto and made a part hereof.

## GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR HILLSIDE REVIEW PERMITS

- 1. Prior to the issuance of any building permits, complete grading and building plans shall be submitted to the Planning Director for approval. Plans shall be in substantial conformity with Exhibit A, dated <a href="December 1, 1877">December 1, 1877</a>, on file in the office of the Planning Department. The property shall be developed in accordance with the approved grading and building plans except where regulations of this or other governmental agencies require deviation therefrom. Prior to and subsequent to the completion of the project, no changes, modifications or alterations shall be made unless and until appropriate applications for amendment of this permit shall have been approved and granted.
- 2. Prior to the issuance of any grading or building permits, a complete landscaping plan, including a permanent watering system, shall be submitted to the Planning Director for approval. Said plans shall be in substantial conformity with Exhibit A, dated <a href="Dec. 1">Dec. 1</a>, 1977, on file in the office of the Planning Department and shall be in accordance with the Hillside Review Ordinance No. 11640 (New Series).

  Approved planting shall be installed prior to the issuance of an occupancy permit on any building. Such planting shall not be modified or altered unless and until this permit shall have been amended to permit such modification or alteration.

- 3. Construction and operation of the approved permit shall comply at all times with the regulations of this or other governmental agencies.
- 4. The effectiveness of this hillside review permit is expressly conditioned upon, and the same shall not become effective for any purpose unless and until the following events shall have occurred:
  - a. Permittee shall have agreed to each and every condition hereof by having this permit signed within 90 days of the Council's decision.
  - b. This hillside review permit executed as indicated shall have been recorded in the office of the County Recorder.
- 5. In addition to any other remedy provided by law, any breach in any of the terms or conditions of this permit or any default on the part of Permittee or its successors in interest, shall be deemed a material breach hereof and this hillside review permit may be cancelled or revoked. Cancellation or revocation of this permit amy be instituted by the City or Permittee. The Planning Director shall set this matter for public hearing before the Planning Commission giving the same notice as provided in Section 101.0506.

  An appeal from the decision of the Planning Commission may be taken to the City Council within ten days after the decision is filed with the City Clerk. The Clerk shall set this matter for public hearing before the City Council giving the same notice as provided in Section 101.0506.

6. This hillside review permit shall inure to the benefit of and shall constitute a covenant running with the lands, and the terms, conditions and provisions hereof shall be binding upon Permittee, and any successor or successors thereto, and the interests of any successor shall be subject to each and every condition herein set out.
