RESOLUTION NO. 220483

WHEREAS, there are numerous abandoned residential structures within the City of San Diego which are now deteriorating but which might be rehabilitated to provide low cost housing to community residents; and

WHEREAS, there are numerous vacant lots within the City of San Diego which are now used for public dumping and which create public nuisances and weed abatement problems; and

WHEREAS, these lots could be better used to construct low cost housing which is affordable by community residents; and

WHEREAS, the City of San Diego is now interested in encouraging the economical rehabilitation of abandoned housing so that community residents may have more opportunities to obtain adequate low cost housing; and

WHEREAS, the City of San Diego is now interested in encouraging the construction of economical and low cost housing on appropriate vacant lots so that community residents may have more opportunities to purchase and own their own homes at prices which are reasonable and affordable; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:



- 1. That the City Manager along with City staff from all appropriate City departments, and the City Attorney, form a task force for the purpose of studying various methods whereby the City of San Diego could stimulate and encourage the economical rehabilitation of abandoned and deteriorating residential structures and stimulate the construction of low cost housing on appropriate vacant lots so that affordable low cost housing can be more readily available to community residents.
- "urban homesteading" as used in other major cities, and shall review all other methods whereby the City of San Diego can create incentives for individuals and families, and for the construction industry, to economically rehabilitate abandoned housing facilities and to construct low cost housing on appropriate vacant lots. That the potential methods to be considered to achieve these goals include, but are not limited to, use of the City's power of condemnation, use of available federal grants, use of low interest loans from interested lenders, use of cooperative programs between the City--property owners--and low bid construction firms, and all other feasible and legal methods.
- 3. That said task force shall consider the preparation of any proposed ordinances or Charter revisions necessary to accomplish the above stated purposes, and also shall consider any needed changes in state law.
