A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO ADOPTING AN AREAWIDE WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN, INCLUDING ACTIONS TO BE UNDERTAKEN TO IMPLEMENT THE PLAN.

OCT 17 1978

WHEREAS, the amendments to the Federal Water Pollution

Control Act of 1972 (PL 92-500) established the national goal

"to restore and maintain the chemical, physical and biological
integrity of the nation's waters" to be achieved through the

eventual elimination of the discharge of pollutants; and

WHEREAS, The Federal Act required states or designated areawide planning agencies to prepare areawide quality management plans to accomplish this goal; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Regulations, part 40 CFR 131.11, set forth the requirements to be met by the Plan; and

WHEREAS, local governments throughout the designated area (western San Diego County and the Santa Margarita Basin in Riverside County) agreed to join with other affected general and special purpose units of local government in a planning process which would result in a coordinated Areawide Water Quality Management Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Comprehensive Planning Organization, together with federal, state and local agencies and citizens advisory committees, has prepared the Areawide Water Quality Management Plan; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that The City of San Diego adopts the Areawide Water Quality Management Plan as the basis for its future water quality management and related planning efforts.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that The City of San Diego agrees that to the best of its ability and subject to the availability of funds to carry out the following activities to aid in implementing the Plan:

- 1. Municipal Wastewater Facilities. Assist, through direct actions or support of other agencies, in the construction of waste disposal and reclamation facilities to satisfy the needs identified in the Plan. The facilities listed in the Plan as annually updated will be the basis for detailed planning pursuant to the Wastewater Treatment System Needs and Management Responsibilities Report, San Diego Metro/Sweetwater and Contiguous Area, Table 33, as well as the reclamation facilities identified in the Plan Summary, copies of which are on file in the office of the City Clerk as Documents No. 765728 and No. 765729
- 2. Erosion and Siltation Control. Review the City's grading ordinance and consider any amendments needed to improve control of water quality as identified in the model ordinance.

 (Plan Summary, Appendix 4.)
 - 3. Continuing Areawide Water Quality Planning Process.
 - a. preparation of the water resources plan, an element of the Areawide Plan, by providing information on proposed water and wastewater programs and requirements;
 - b. biennial regional growth forecasts, by providing information on land use and demographic changes and local policy;

- c. air quality attainment and maintenance plan, by assisting in the development and implementation of mitigation measures that are consistent with City policy.
- 4. Spheres of Influence. Provide assistance to the Local Agency Formation Commission in establishing and maintaining spheres of influence.
- 5. Project Review in Fringe Areas. Cooperate with the County in developing procedures and in annually providing information on the City's proposed projects (for voluntary review) as well as comments on projects of other agencies that may affect the City.
- 6. Los Penasquitos Lagoon. Prepare a Lagoon Management
 Program for Los Penasquitos Lagoon as a part of the State mandated Local Coastal Program. This program will evaluate the
 beneficial uses which are appropriate for the lagoon and prepare
 a program for attaining or maintaining these beneficial uses.
- 7. San Diego Bay. Participate in an interagency water quality management program for San Diego Bay to be initiated by the Regional Water Quality Control Board. The objective is to clean up and prevent flotable trash and oil in the Bay. (Plan Summary.)
- 8. Mission Bay. Continue water quality management activities in Mission Bay. These activities include the repair of faulty sewers in the area and the location of a creation vehicle waste disposal station at Mission Bay Visitor Center.
- 9. Groundwater Management. Implement the pertinent recommended groundwater quality programs identified on Table 7,

<u>Plan Summary</u>. These include the control of self-regenerating brine systems in areas tributary to reclamation plants, encourage safe yield operation of groundwater basins and encourage the maximum use of local surface water reservoirs.

- 10. Residual Wastes. Participate in a study of the disposal of residual wastes. As part of the continuing planning process, it is intended that the County of San Diego will work with the CPO to prepare a facilities plan for the handling and disposal of sludge generated over the next 20 years.
- 11. Tia Juana Estuary. Continue efforts through the United States Section of the International Boundary and Water Commission to obtain improvement of sewage collection and disposal and of municipal solid waste handling practices in the City of Tijuana, Baja California.
- 12. Tia Juana Estuary. In cooperation with the City of Imperial Beach, prepare a Lagoon Management Program for the Tia Juana Estuary as part of the State mandated Local Coastal Program.
- 13. Water Conservation. Identify the appropriate water conservation programs to meet water use reduction objectives for your service area. The CWA, in cooperation with retail water agencies, will set water use reduction objectives by January 1980.

The County Water Authority should monitor attainment of the water use reduction objectives.
