AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER VIII, ARTICLE 6, DEC 3 1973
OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING
SECTION 86.27 RELATING TO HEAVY DUTY VEHICLES
IN RESIDENTIAL DISTRICTS.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego,
as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter VIII, Article 6, of the San Diego
Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended by amending
Section 86.27 to read as follows:

SEC. 86.27 PARKING OF HEAVY DUTY COMMERCIAL OR
OTHER VEHICLES IN RESIDENTIAL DISTRICTS

No person shall park any heavy duty commercial
or other vehicles more than three (3) hours on a street
in any residential district except (a) while loading
or unloading property and time in addition to such
three (3) hour period is necessary to complete the
work, or (b) when such vehicle is parked in connection
with, and in aid of, the performance of a service to
or on a property in the block in which such vehicle
is parked and time in addition to such three (3) hour
period is reasonably necessary to complete such
service, or (c) such vehicle is parked immediately in
front of or along side of premises actively devoted
to industry or commerce and lying contiguous to the
street.

For the purpose of this section, certain terms shall be defined as follows:


1. Heavy duty commercial or other vehicle shall mean a single vehicle or combination of vehicles having more than two axles, a single vehicle or combination of vehicles twenty (20) feet or more in length, or a single vehicle or combination of vehicles six (6) feet, eight (8) inches or more in width, and shall include, but shall not be limited to, dump trucks, moving vans, tractors, pole, or pipe dollies, house trailers or trailers or house car as defined in the California Vehicle Code Section 362, but shall not include a motor vehicle to which a camper has been attached. No camper body which has been detached from the motor vehicle shall be left standing on a City street at any time.

2. Residential district shall mean any block in which over fifty percent (50%) of the ground level buildings fronting on said block are dwellings. Said dwellings may be single-unit structures or multi-unit structures.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage.

SECTION 88.27 PARKING OF HEAVY DUTY COMMERCIAL OR OTHER VEHICLES IN RESIDENTIAL DISTRICTS

No person shall park any heavy duty commercial or other vehicle more than three (3) hours on a street in any residential district except (a) while loading or unloading property and time in addition to such three (3) hour period is necessary to complete the work, or (b) when such vehicle is parked in connection with, and in aid of, the performance of a service to or on a property in the block in which such vehicle is parked and time in addition to such three (3) hour period is reasonably necessary to complete such service, or (c) such vehicle is parked immediately in front of or along side of premises actively devoted to industry or commerce and lying contiguous to the street.
