# RESOLUTION NO. R- 250327

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF AND THE ADVERTISING FOR BIDS FOR THE PURCHASE OF 1979 TAX ANTICIPATION NOTES IN THE AGGREGATE AMOUNT OF SIXTEEN MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$16,500,000) AND HIRING BOND COUNSEL FOR AN OPINION REGARDING SAID NOTES.

WHEREAS, funds are needed to meet the cash requirements of The City of San Diego for the fiscal year 1979-80, including but not limited to the payment of current expenses, capital expenditures and the discharge of any obligations or indebtedness; and

WHEREAS, Section 92 of the Charter of The City of San Diego permits the issuance of notes for the purpose of borrowing money in anticipation of the collection of taxes in any fiscal year (hereinafter referred to as "Notes"); and

WHEREAS, The City of San Diego contemplates the issuance of Notes in the aggregate amount of Sixteen Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$16,500,000), said Notes to be dated October 30, 1979 and to be paid on June 26, 1980; and

WHEREAS, the issuance of Notes should be accomplished by inviting competitive bids; and

WHEREAS, the successful bidder should be furnished, at the expense of City, a legal opinion regarding the validity of the Notes; and

WHEREAS, the law firm of O'Melveny & Myers has indicated its willingness to review the record of the proceedings and

render its opinion regarding the validity of the Notes by a letter dated September 18, 1979, a copy of which is on file in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. R. 250327;

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

- 1. This Council finds and determines that it is necessary for the City to issue 1979 Tax Anticipation Notes in the aggregate amount of Sixteen Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$16,500,000) in order to meet the cash requirements of the City during the fiscal year 1979-80, which Notes will be issued in anticipation of the collection of taxes during the fiscal year 1979-80.
- 2. The City Clerk is hereby directed to advertise a notice inviting bids for the purchase of 1979 Tax Anticipation Notes in the aggregate amount of Sixteen Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$16,500,000) to be repaid on June 26, 1980.
- 3. The Notice Inviting Bids shall be published once at least five (5) days prior to the opening of the bids. Bids shall be opened on October 23, 1979, and the award made the same day.
- 4. A legal opinion as to the validity of the Notes shall be secured at the expense of City from the law firm of O'Melveny & Myers and shall be furnished to the successful bidder for the purchase of the Notes. For rendering its opinion, O'Melveny & Myers shall receive the sum of Six Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$6,500) plus out-of-pocket expenses.

- 5. The Notice Inviting Bids shall be substantially in the form of Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein.
- 6. Bids shall be submitted substantially in the form of Exhibit B attached hereto and incorporated herein.
- 7. The Resolution of Award shall be substantially in the form of Exhibit C attached hereto and incorporated herein.
- 8. The Notes to be issued by the City shall be substantially in the form of Exhibit D attached hereto and incorporated herein; and they shall be manually signed by the City Treasurer or Assistant City Treasurer, if the City Treasurer is unavailable, and facsimile signatures of the Mayor and City Clerk shall be used.
- 9. The Treasurer's Receipt for the money received shall be substantially in the form of Exhibit E attached hereto and incorporated herein.
- 10. The Official Statement which shall be provided to any interested bidder, shall provide certain information relating to the City's budget, finances, economic condition, tax base, debt management and certain contingent liabilities, and shall be substantially in the form of Exhibit F attached hereto and incorporated herein.
- 11. The Notes shall be dated as of October 30, 1979 and shall be in the denomination of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) each, or any multiple thereof, at the option of the successful bidder and shall be payable as to both principal and interest by the City on June 26, 1980. They shall bear a stated interest rate not to exceed five percent (5%) per annum from the date of said Notes to and including June 26, 1980, computed on the basis of a 360-day year.

- 12. Both the principal of and the interest on the Notes shall be payable by the City in lawful money of the United States of America at the office of the City Treasurer, City Administration Building, 202 C Street, San Diego, California, or, at the option of the holder, at the office of the fiscal agent of the City in New York, New York; Chicago, Illinois; or San Francisco, Los Angeles or San Diego, California.
- 13. The Notes shall be payable out of the taxes of the fiscal year 1979-80 during which the Notes are to be issued; provided, however, the principal of the Notes and any interest thereon may be paid from any other monies of the City lawfully available therefor.

MATURITY: The Notes will mature on June 26, 1980.

INTEREST: The Notes shall bear interest at a stated interest rate to be fixed upon the sale thereof but not to exceed five (5) percent per annum, payable at maturity. Interest shall be computed on a 360-day basis.

FORM OF NOTES: The Notes will be issued in negotiable form, payable to bearer, without coupons, and will be nonregisterable.

REDEMPTION: The Notes are not subject to call and redemption prior to maturity.

PURPOSE OF ISSUE: The proceeds of the Notes will be used for current general fund expenditures, including current expenses, capital expenditures, and the discharge of any obligation or indebtedness of the City.

SECURITY: The Notes are issued pursuant to Section 92 of the Charter of the City of San Diego and Article 7.6, Chapter 4, Part 1, Division 2, Title 5 (commencing with Section 53850) of the Government Code of the State of California, and shall be payable out of the taxes of the Fiscal Year 1979-80, said taxes being hereby pledged to repay said Notes; provided, however, that if said taxes or any portion thereof when received by the City will be encumbered for a special purpose other than the repayment of said Notes, then an equivalent amount of the proceeds of said Notes shall be set aside for and used for said special purpose;

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and provided further that said Notes with interest thereon may be paid from any other moneys of the City lawfully available therefor. Such other moneys shall include but not be limited to moneys derived from sales and use taxes, City license and permit fees, and other similar sources of municipal income.

#### TERMS OF SALE

INTEREST RATE: The maximum stated interest rate bid may not exceed 5% per annum, payable at maturity. Each rate bid must be a multiple of 1/100. No Note shall bear more than one interest rate. Each Note must bear interest at the rate specified in the bid from its date to its fixed maturity date.

AWARD: Each bid will be publicly opened in Council Chambers and will be subject to acceptance until the conclusion of Council business on October 23, 1979. Bidders must offer to purchase all of the Notes. The Notes will be awarded on the basis in any amount of the lowest net interest cost to the City after considering discount offered in the bids. The resolution of the Council of the City of San Diego making the award shall be substantially in the form of Exhibit C attached to Resolution No.

RIGHT OF REJECTION: The City reserves the right, in its discretion, to reject any and all bids and to the extent not prohibited by law to waive any irregularity or informality in any bid.

PROMPT AWARD: The Council will take action awarding the Notes or rejecting all bids not later than conclusion of Council business on October 23, 1979.

PLACE OF DELIVERY AND FUNDS FOR PAYMENT: Delivery of said Notes will be made to the successful bidder at the office of the City Treasurer in San Diego, California, on October 30, 1979, provided, however, that City and purchaser may identify a later delivery date by mutual consent.

Payment for the Notes shall be made in Federal Reserve Bank funds or other immediately available funds.

The cost of printing the Notes shall be borne by the City.

PROMPT DELIVERY; CANCELLATION FOR LATE DELIVERY: It is expected that said Notes will be delivered to the successful bidder on October 30, 1979. Any successful bidder shall have the right, at his option, to cancel the contract of purchase if the City shall fail to execute the Notes and tender them for delivery within 30 days from the date herein fixed for the receipt of bids.

FORM OF BID: Each bid must be in a sealed envelope, addressed to the Clerk of the City of San Diego, with the envelope clearly marked "Bid for San Diego, 1979 Tax Anticipation Notes." Each bid must be in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth herein, and must be submitted on proposal forms provided by the City.

BID CHECK: A certified or cashier's check on a responsible bank or trust company in the amount of Fifty-Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) payable to the order of the City Treasurer, must accompany each bid as a guaranty that the bidder, if successful, will accept and pay for the Notes in accordance with the terms of his bid. The check accompanying any accepted proposal shall be applied to the purchase price or, if such proposal is accepted but not performed, unless such failure or performance shall be caused by any act or omission of the City, it shall then be

cashed and the proceeds retained by the City Treasurer. The check accompanying each unaccepted bid will be returned promptly.

CHANGE IN TAX EXEMPT STATUS: At any time before the Notes are tendered for delivery, any successful bidder may disaffirm and withdraw his proposal if the interest received by private holders from notes of the same type and character shall be declared to be taxable income under present federal income tax laws, either by a ruling of the Internal Revenue Service or by a decision of any federal court, or shall be declared taxable or be required to be taken into account in computing any federal income taxes, by the terms of any federal income tax law enacted subsequent to the date of this notice.

CLOSING PAPERS; LEGAL OPINION: Each bid will be understood to be conditioned upon the City furnishing to successful bidder, without charge, concurrently with payment for and delivery of the Notes, the following closing papers, each dated the date of such delivery:

- (a) The opinion of O'MELVENY & MYERS of Los Angeles, California, Bond Counsel, approving the validity of the Notes and stating that interest on the Notes is exempt from income taxes of the United States of America under present federal income tax laws, and that such interest is also exempt from personal income taxes of the State of California under present State income tax laws.
- (b) The certificate of the City Auditor and Comptroller that on the basis of the facts, estimates and circumstances in existence on the date of issue, it is not expected that the proceeds of the Notes will be used in a manner that would violate the arbitrage provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as amended.
- (c) The certificate of the City Attorney of the City of San Diego acting on behalf of the City solely in his official, and not in his personal, capacity, that there is no litigation threatened or pending affecting the validity of the Notes;
- (d) The certificate dated as of the closing by an appropriate City official, acting on behalf of the City solely in his official, and not in his personal, capacity, that at the time of the sale of the Notes and at all time subsequent thereto up to and including the time of the delivery of the Notes to the initial purchasers thereof the Official Statement of the City pertaining to said Notes did not contain any untrue statement of a material fact or omit to state a material fact necessary to make the statements therein, in light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading;
- (e) The signature certificate of the officials of the City, showing that they have signed the Notes, whether by facsimile or manual signature, and that they were respectively duly authorized to execute the same; and
- (f) The receipt of the City Treasurer showing that the purchase price of the Notes, including interest accrued to the date of delivery thereof, has been received by her.

SECURITY: The Notes are issued pursuant to Section 92 of the Charter of the City of San Diego and Article 7.6, Chapter 4, Part 1, Division 2, Title 5 (commencing with Section 53850) of the Government Code of the State of California, and shall be payable out of the taxes of the Fiscal Year 1979-80, said taxes being hereby pledged to repay said Notes; provided, however, that if said taxes or any portion thereof when received by the City will be encumbered for a special purpose other than the repayment of said Notes, then an equivalent amount of the proceeds of said Notes shall be set aside for and used for said special purpose; and provided further that said Notes with interest thereon may be paid from any other moneys of the City lawfully available therefor. Such other moneys shall include but not be limited to moneys derived from sales and use taxes, City license and permit fees, and other similar sources of municipal income.

#### TERMS OF SALE

INTEREST RATE: The maximum stated interest rate bid may not exceed 5% per annum, payable at maturity. Each rate bid must be a multiple of 1/100. No Note shall bear more than one interest rate. Each Note must bear interest at the rate specified in the bid from its date to its fixed maturity date.

AWARD: Each bid will be publicly opened in Council Chambers and will be subject to acceptance until the conclusion of Council business on October 23, 1979. Bidders must offer to purchase all of the Notes. The Notes will be awarded on the basis in any amount of the lowest net interest cost to the City after considering discount offered in the bids. The resolution of the Council of the City of San Diego making the award shall be substantially in the form of Exhibit C attached to Resolution No.

RIGHT OF REJECTION: The City reserves the right, in its discretion, to reject any and all bids and to the extent not prohibited by law to waive any irregularity or informality in any bid.

PROMPT AWARD: The Council will take action awarding the Notes or rejecting all bids not later than conclusion of Council business on October 23, 1979.

PLACE OF DELIVERY AND FUNDS FOR PAYMENT: Delivery of said Notes will be made to the successful bidder at the office of the City Treasurer in San Diego, California, on October 30, 1979, provided, however, that City and purchaser may identify a later delivery date by mutual consent.

Payment for the Notes shall be made in Federal Reserve Bank funds or other immediately available funds.

The cost of printing the Notes shall be borne by the City.

PROMPT DELIVERY; CANCELLATION FOR LATE DELIVERY: It is expected that said Notes will be delivered to the successful bidder on October 30, 1979. Any successful bidder shall have the right, at his option, to cancel the contract of purchase if the City shall fail to execute the Notes and tender them for delivery within 30 days from the date herein fixed for the receipt of bids.

FORM OF BID: Each bid must be in a sealed envelope, addressed to the Clerk of the City of San Diego, with the envelope clearly marked "Bid for San Diego, 1979 Tax Anticipation Notes." Each bid must be in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth herein, and must be submitted on proposal forms provided by the City.

BID CHECK: A certified or cashier's check on a responsible bank or trust company in the amount of Fifty-Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) payable to the order of the City Treasurer, must accompany each bid as a guaranty that the bidder, if successful, will accept and pay for the Notes in accordance with the terms of his bid. The check accompanying any accepted proposal shall be applied to the purchase price or, if such proposal is accepted but not performed, unless such failure or performance shall be caused by any act or omission of the City, it shall then be

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cashed and the proceeds retained by the City Treasurer. The check accompanying each unaccepted bid will be returned promptly.

CHANGE IN TAX EXEMPT STATUS: At any time before the Notes are tendered for delivery, any successful bidder may disaffirm and withdraw his proposal if the interest received by private holders from notes of the same type and character shall be declared to be taxable income under present federal income tax laws, either by a ruling of the Internal Revenue Service or by a decision of any federal court, or shall be declared taxable or be required to be taken into account in computing any federal income taxes, by the terms of any federal income tax law enacted subsequent to the date of this notice.

CLOSING PAPERS; LEGAL OPINION: Each bid will be understood to be conditioned upon the City furnishing to successful bidder, without charge, concurrently with payment for and delivery of the Notes, the following closing papers, each dated the date of such delivery:

- (a) The opinion of O'MELVENY & MYERS of Los Angeles, California, Bond Counsel, approving the validity of the Notes and stating that interest on the Notes is exempt from income taxes of the United States of America under present federal income tax laws, and that such interest is also exempt from personal income taxes of the State of California under present State income tax laws.
- (b) The certificate of the City Auditor and Comptroller that on the basis of the facts, estimates and circumstances in existence on the date of issue, it is not expected that the proceeds of the Notes will be used in a manner that would violate the arbitrage provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as amended.
- (c) The certificate of the City Attorney of the City of San Diego acting on behalf of the City solely in his official, and not in his personal, capacity, that there is no litigation threatened or pending affecting the vahidity of the Notes;
- (d) The certificate dated as of the closing by an appropriate City official, acting on behalf of the City solely in his official, and not in his personal, capacity, that at the time of the sale of the Notes and at all time subsequent thereto up to and including the time of the delivery of the Notes to the initial purchasers thereof the Official Statement of the City pertaining to said Notes did not contain any untrue statement of a material fact or omit to state a material fact necessary to make the statements therein, in light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading;
- (e) The signature certificate of the officials of the City, showing that they have signed the Notes, whether by facsimile or manual signature, and that they were respectively duly authorized to execute the same; and
- (f) The receipt of the City Treasurer showing that the purchase price of the Notes, including interest accrued to the date of delivery thereof, has been received by her.
